BOY SAMARITAN TELLS TALE THAT MELTS MAGISTRATE

Stole to Alleviate Sufferings of Tuberculosis Victim Far From Home.

Two seventeen-year-old boys, Henry Union of No. 304 West Twenty-ninth street, and Philip Ford of No. 256 West Thirty-first street, were released on parole by Judge Foster in the Court of General Sessions to-day after they had told an affecting story of loyalty in distress, which was verified by Father E. J. Higgins of the Church of St. Columba, in West Twenty-fifth street; Father Lench of the Catholic Protector, and Miss Brady, his investigator.

Union ran away from his father's sugar plantation, in Porto Rico, more than a year ago. Making his way to this city he found work with Dodd's Express. Ford was already employed there and they became friends. Union was seriously affected with tuberculosis. A month ago Union became too weak to work.

Ford tried to persuade his mother to take his friend in. She refused. He asked her to let him take food out to Union. She said that in Union's condition, it was suicide to have anything to do with him.

On Sept. 20 Ford's money had all run out and he was unable to smuggle food any longer. In desperation, the boys broke into an unoccupied building at No. 307 Seventh avenue, of which Charles K. Keller is the agent. There Ford, who was too ill to walk about, hid in a hole in the wall. He also hid in the hole in the basement and told it to buy food. It was this theft which Keller reported to the police.

Union, who was hardly able to stand up to the bar in court when he pleaded guilty, showed a money order for \$25 from his mother and a letter, begging him to come home. The Catholic Protector promised to see him on the boat and to go surety for the good behavior of Ford. A pitiable feature of the case was that Ford seems to have contracted his friend's disease.

SAYS MAN SLAIN ON PIER WAS LONG LOST BROTHER.

Police Still Unable to Solve Mystery in Killing of McQuillen.

J. McQuillen of No. 32 Ashcroft road, New London, Conn., identified at morgue to-day the body of the man murdered on the Harbor Police pier on Monday as that of his brother, Peter McQuillen, a wanderer from his city for many years.

The police found that McQuillen had been killed by a stab wound at the back of his neck. He had run a few feet, apparently, and fallen dead. There were a number of weapons on the pier at the time, and though it was daylight the police could find no one who had seen the assault. Near the place they found a dilapidated suit case of foreign make containing a pair of arm protectors such as are used by sailors in the tropics.

They found letters in McQuillen's pockets indicating that he had reason to believe the husband of a woman with whom he was friendly. Detectives Moody and Leeson, water front veterans, are hunting the murderer.
