# BARGAIN FRIDAY at SIMPSON CRAWFORDS

**ROTTEN AREAS OF PAVEMENT, SAYS McANENY**  
That Was Fusion's Inheritance In Manhattan, Which He Is Trying to Repair.

Deputy Sheriff Lewis Edwards of White Plains has branched out as an expert on street paving and called forth a Gaiety letter from Borough President McAneny. Deputy Sheriff Edwards, who paid a visit to the metropolis recently, became enamored of the condition of the streets of Manhattan and then sent a letter from White Plains to the Borough President complimenting that official on the fine pavements in this borough.

Mr. McAneny answered as follows: "I have read your letter with interest, and thank you for it very heartily. From your experience, you readily understand as any one with a grain of horse sense ought to—that we have done the best that we could do with the rotten areas of pavement inherited in Manhattan. The only remedy is the substitution of modern pavement for the old and obsolete. In pursuance of a policy of this sort, we have repaved forty-one miles in Manhattan during the current year, against twenty-four miles in 1910 and eighteen miles the year before. Constant attention has been given, too, to the question of up-to-date types of pavement, and before another year is passed the results will speak for themselves.

There is little use in talking about this sort of thing, however, to people who don't want to know, or whose purpose is to misrepresent everything that proceeds from the Fusion Government. I have thought that sometimes such people get the ear of the public much more readily than those who have a plain case of fact to state; but just as a certain remedy cannot be prevented, I shall keep in mind your kind offer to lend your advice.

**VAUDEVILLE TRUST WON'T FIGHT THE NEW LAW.**

Lawyer for United Booking Office Withdraws Application for an Injunction.

The United Booking Office has withdrawn its suit against Mayor Gaynor and Herman Robinson, Commissioner of the Bureau of Licenses, to prevent them from enforcing the provisions of the law placing theatrical agencies on a par with other employment agencies. The vaudeville concern, which is described as a trust in a suit now pending in the State Supreme Court, has twice sought an injunction in the United States Circuit Court. They have contended that the section of the statute requiring all agencies to file statements in regard to contracts and fees charged is unconstitutional. Their first application for an injunction was denied by Judge Lacombe, but since then Henry W. Taft, President Taft's brother, has been retained as their counsel, but he has discontinued the last action.

In dismissing the motion for the first restraining order Judge Lacombe said: "When the various employers, actors and vaudeville shows find that they cannot obtain the services of the complainant (the United Booking Office) or of any other agency in this State except upon furnishing the information the law not unnecessarily requires, they will probably be willing to do so. There may be some temporary shrinkage in the complainant's business, but its extent is problematical."

**RUN OVER AND KILLED.**

On his way home from work in the driving rainstorm early today, Patrick Murphy, sixty-five years old, a veteran employee of the Department of Water Supply, was run over by a big truck of the New York Transfer Company at Eighteenth street and Eighth avenue. He died three hours later in New York Hospital.

Murphy's home was at No. 246 West Eighteenth street. John Frazier of No. 44 West Thirty-ninth street, driver of the truck, was arrested and arraigned in Jefferson Market Court, where he was held to await the inquest. Murphy had just left a car when he was struck. He had his head down and was running toward the sidewalk.
