57 VARIETIES OF UNFIT FOOD SHOWN IN COURT

Many Dealers Confess Watering Milk or Selling Bad Eggs, Pies and Meat.

The crusade of the State Department of Health against dealers in adulterated food stuffs, brought to-day before Justice Steinert, Forker and Deuel, in Part J, Special Sessions, fifty-seven tradesmen, many of whom pleaded guilty to selling watered milk, adulterated olive oil and drugs, decayed mince pies, meat and fish, and the use of rotten eggs in cake.

Louis Hammer, a baker, of No. 279 East Tenth street, was sent to the City Prison for thirty days on the testimony of Inspector Taylor, who found 100 dozen rotten eggs in the place.

Moses Frankel acknowledged selling decayed bluefish and sea bass July 21 at his market, No. 92 Vesey street, and paid a fine of \$100.

Bernard Rosner, a confectioner at No. 282 Third avenue, was fined \$5 for selling worm-eaten candy.

Frank Ferrar, a grocer at No. 1550 Second avenue, who pleaded guilty of adulterating eighty quarts of milk, tried to blame it on a discharged errand boy looking for revenge.

Paul Herzog, No. 179 Fifth avenue, and Gustave Hirsch, No. 650 Eleventh avenue, milk adulterators, paid \$25. Sentences were suspended in the cases of Freda Herburger of No. 228 West One Hundred and Twenty-fourth street, Frank C. Kramer of No. 707 Columbus avenue and Max Magenheim of No. 1322 Madison avenue, whose milk adulterations amounted to only 2 per cent.

Joseph Frank, of No. 269 Ninth avenue, paid \$50 for selling unwholesome veal. George Krause, manager for George Joseph & Co., butchers, at No. 518 Westchester avenue, charged with the same offense had only started on his job the day he was arrested and a mistrial was directed.

Corporation Attorney Steffel was ordered to proceed against his employers, using Krause as a witness.

Frank Fozzani went to the City Prison for twenty days because he could not pay a fine of \$50 for selling bad veal at his shop, No. 40 Monroe street.

Moses Lowenstein paid a fine of \$30 imposed on Sylvan Levy for selling decayed meat and poultry at Lowenstein's shop, No. 475 East Tremont avenue.

A waitress in a restaurant at No. 259 Madison street, Minna Rudinsky, was allowed to go with a suspended sentence for serving adulterated cream.

TWO MORE CITIES CAPTURED BY THE CHINESE REBELS

Changsha and Nanchang in Revolutionists' Hands, Who Now Control 4 Provinces.

SHANGHAI, China, Oct. 21.—The capture by the revolutionists of the more important southern cities, Changsha and Nanchang, was announced in despatches which reached this city early to-day.

Four of China's eighteen provinces are now regarded as under revolutionary influence—Szechuen, where the movement started; Hubei, of which Wuhan is the capital; Hunan and Kiangsi. The fall of Nanking, where the garrison is regarded as siding with the revolutionists, would deliver to them the viceregal government of three more provinces—Kiangsu, Kiangsi and Nganhwei.

German banks, it was learned to-day, have sold to New York banking interests about \$10,000,000 of Prussian treasury bills, the total issue of which is \$20,000,000. The notes, as they are called, are to run for six months and are being sold here on a 4-1-4 per cent. basis, with exchange guarantee.

JUDGE REFUSES TO FORFEIT \$50,000 BAIL OF DUVEEN

United States Attorney Wise to-day failed in an effort to have Benjamin J. Duveen, of the firm of Duveen Bros., the art importers, declared a fugitive from justice and his bail of \$50,000 forfeited.

The United States Attorney made the motion before Judge Hough in the United States Circuit Court, but the judge gave the youngest of the four brothers until Nov. 13 to appear in court for pleading. On that day, the Court said, the matter must be finally disposed of.

John B. Stanchfield declared that Benjamin J. Duveen was in London at the bedside of a very ill mother, whose recovery is doubtful.

Mr. Wise called attention to the fact that Louis J. and Joseph J.—who were in-court with Mr. Stanchfield and stood at his side throughout the argument—and Henry J. Duveen had come into court and pleaded guilty and had been fined for defrauding the Government.

"Last April," declared Mr. Wise, "in the midst of the wireless trial Mr. Stanchfield brought in Henry J. Duveen and Benjamin J. Duveen, and without warning entered a plea of guilty for them. Henry J. Duveen was fined \$15,000. In order to prevent Benjamin J. Duveen being taken into custody by the marshal he was allowed to withdraw his plea for a day on the understanding that he would be in court the next day. But the next day when it seemed certain that Judge Martin would impose a jail sentence on him he did not appear and has not appeared since."
