

JOHN S. KENNEDY'S ESTATE APPRAISED AT \$67,137,735

72 Individuals and 60 Institutions Receive Bequests From J. J. Hill's Banker.

MANY COLLEGES AIDED.

Public Library, Art Museum and Columbia Get More Than \$2,000,000 Each.

Deputy State Comptroller John Harburger today filed with the surrogate's court the appraiser's report of the estate of John S. Kennedy, who died Oct. 21, 1909, at his home, No. 6 West Fifty-seventh street.

The estate consisted in part of 10,000 shares of the Northern Pacific Railroad Company, valued at \$2,750,000, and which at the time of Mr. Kennedy's death had a market value of \$2,750,000.

are valued at \$2,500 and \$2,000 respectively. Included in Mr. Kennedy's effects were fishing tackle valued at \$200.

Mr. Kennedy left no children, but divided his estate among seventy-two individuals and sixty institutions, among them being the widow, Mrs. Emma B. Kennedy, who acts an aggressive interest in the estate of \$16,782,901.21; Henry B. Baker, no relation, \$16,532; James B. Baker, no relation, \$12,224; John Kennedy Tod, nephew, \$12,223; Mary Ann Tod, niece, \$12,212; Charlotte S. Baker, no relation, \$1,138,145.96; William S. Tod, nephew, \$1,260,425; David A. Tod, \$100,424; Robert E. Tod, nephew, \$1,958,556; Marion G. Tod, niece, \$477,823; Emma B. Tod, niece, \$202,625; Julia B. Tod, niece, \$111,820; Mabel Kennedy Tod, niece, \$225,600; William Edgar Baker, no relation, \$69,342; Christopher S. Baker, no relation, \$67,108; and Emilio H. Baker, no relation, \$68,221.

The executors are the widow, Mrs. Emma B. Kennedy, William S. Tod and Robert E. Tod, nephews, and Robert L. de Forest.

The appraiser's report, when at first filed, attracted Surrogate Cahalan's attention because of the unusual amount of the estate. The surrogate made a ruling that the value of the estate as first filed was not correct, saying the quotations in the stocks should be a general average of the price ranges for two months before and two months subsequent to the date of death. The estate as originally filed was valued at \$65,553,777.77, but was returned after the ruling had been made.

While the guards on the platform of the One Hundred and Tenth street subway station were calling out their mo-


