GEN. CANEVA CABLES DEFENSE OF ITALIAN ARMY IN TRIPOLI.

TRIPOLI, AFRICA, NOV. 9.—If reproach may be made us it is only for our exceeding indulgence and benevolence toward the natives. The soldiers were directed to treat the Arabs on friendly terms respecting their traditions.

Natives were passing in and out of the trenches Oct. 23, while Turks with about 6,000 natives armed with Mausers, attacked our lines.

The soldiers were surprised and massacred, and so it was necessary to guarantee our safety and that of the Europeans.

Everybody admires the kindness and discipline of the soldiers, who nurse the native children, wounded and abandoned.

ITALIANS FIGHT BACK TURKS IN TRIPOLI ATTACK

Repeated Advances of Moslem Troops Fail and Many Are Killed.

TRIPOLI, Nov. 10.—Turkish artillery and Arab horsemen made several attacks upon the Italian lines yesterday. The Italians responded with an advance and fought their way to the trenches of the enemy, who temporarily retired, but again attacked as the Italians were returning to their base.

The Italians sustained some casualties and the Arabs and Turks many. WASHINGTON, Nov. 10.—A message to the Italian War Office at Rome from Tripoli, dated Nov. 8, forwarded to the Embassy here, states that on Nov. 7 the Ninety-third Italian Infantry and

the Eleventh "Bersaglieri," made reconnoissances on the Oriental frontier and found among the Arab dead and wounded the bodies of some Turks. On Nov. 8 shells from the battery at Fort Sidi Morsi, put to flight a large force of Arabs.

CARUSO TAKES 3 PIANOS INTO HIS HOTEL SUITE.

ECHO OF PANIC OF 1907 HEARD AT HEINZE TRIAL.

Ex-Comptroller Scores Brothers in His Address to Jury in Note Case.

An echo of the panic of 1907 was heard in the Supreme Court today, when the suit brought by Harriman & Co., bankers and brokers, against Ruth Nyea Heinze, wife of Arthur P. Heinze, and Calvin G. Geer, to recover on a note for \$1,000, was brought to trial before Justice Greenbaum and a

Jury. Edward M. Grout, counsel for Harriman & Co., in his opening address to the jury, bitterly attacked the three Heinze brothers—Otto, P. Augustus and Arthur. "We will show," thundered Mr. Grout to the jury, "that these three brothers attempted to pay dividends on worthless stock with money not earned by the fraudulent concern they started. This was one of the causes that led to the panic, with which you are all familiar."
