

ICY WINDOW BARS FLIGHT AT FIRE

Mrs. Manuel Karlin and her three children were at breakfast today in their apartment at No. 547 East One Hundred and Thirty-ninth street when the oil stove in the kitchen was accidentally upset. There was a burst of flame and smoke and then an explosion.

The dining-room window gave onto a fire escape. Mrs. Karlin rushed to the window. She could not raise it. It was frozen to the sill. In her terror, with the screams of the children in her ears, she dashed her fist through the glass, trying vainly to make an opening large enough to afford a way of escape.

The house is a four-story brick, owned by the Karlins and occupied by eight families. The smoke and noise attracted Mrs. Henry Jaffe, Mrs. Karlin's mother, who lived next door with her sons, Max and Leon. The men rushed in and carried the three children—Beatrice, Henry and Annie—to the street. Then they ran back and brought down aged Mrs. Jaffe and Mrs. Karlin, whose hand was bleeding from cuts by the window glass. Mr. Karlin had just left the house for his office.

The fire did \$10,000 damage through the house and drove the eight families into the street. Dr. Wolf of Lincoln Hospital bound up Mrs. Karlin's wounded hand. Streams of water thrown by firemen turned the ruins into a glittering ice palace.


