WENT CHEERILY TO DEATH CHAIR

Swinton, Negro Murderer, Shouted Goodby to Prisoners and Officials.

Charles Swinton, colored, was electrocuted this morning in Sing Sing prison for the murder of Isaac Lee in New York City on Nov. 3, 1910.

He was strapped in the death chair at 5.30 o'clock, and after two applications was pronounced dead at 5.40. He exhibited no fear in entering the death chamber.

Swinton was convicted on Dec. 19 following the murder, but took an appeal. In trying to get a new trial he made the novel plea that one of the twelve jurors who found him guilty was repeatedly found asleep during the trial.

The Court of Appeals decided he had a fair trial and affirmed the sentence a short time ago. An effort was made to get Gov. Dix to interfere, but he refused.

Swinton went to the chair cheerfully, and on his way shouted good-by to those who had been in the death-house with him and to the Warden, principal keeper and prison physician.

The autopsy took place at once. Sheriff Julius Harburger of New York called attention to the ruling of Attorney-General Carmody that autopsies may not be performed for forty-eight hours, but the Warden decided that as he had no official notification from the Attorney-

General the autopsy could proceed as usual. Swinton filled the death chair as few men have on account of his size. He was almost four feet across the shoulders.

Sheriff Harburger announced that he would attend all executions of men convicted in New York County and that he would watch with interest the effect of the postponement of the autopsies.

Swinton killed Isaac Lee, also colored, during a quarrel over a codfish.

DIES UNDER CAR WHEELS.

A well dressed man about fifty years old was run over and killed by a South-bound car at Thirty-seventh street and First avenue at 10.30 last night. John Westphal of No. 88 West One Hundred and Fourth street, the motorman, put on the brakes but saw the man too late to save him.

Dr. Irey on his arrival from Bellevue Hospital said the man had been killed instantly. The motorman, who was taken with the body to the East Thirty-fifth street station, was later released to his company's custody. In the dead man's pockets were found a pay envelope marked "A. Sharkey, care Child's restaurant, No. 125 Broadway," and a letter similarly addressed to "Robert Sharkey," and signed "Your loving brother, Louis Sharkey."
