

MISS CAMERON IS TO RETURN SOON TO CLAIM ESTATE

Hawley Household at Babylon Secretly Informed She Will Soon Come Back.

HEIRS STILL WORRIED. Report of Rupture Between Them and Financier's Ward Is Denied, However.

The heirs-at-law of the late Edwin R. Hawley are openly worrying as the days lengthen into weeks without the disclosure by Miss Margaret Cameron, the ward of Mr. Hawley and the head of his city and country homes, of the nature of the documents she holds affecting the ownership of the tens of millions of dollars he left behind him.

From many sources they know Mr. Hawley's woman of mystery has documents which she and her attorney believe entitle her to a considerable share of the great estate. They know the servants of the household, and especially men who live, winter and summer, at the big place near Babylon, have had messages from her that she is to take formal possession of the place soon, and that they are all to hold their employment.

Investigators from the office of Levy and Stanfield have verified the discovery of The Evening World, last Saturday, that Henry Peterson, Mr. Hawley's principal chauffeur, and John Williams, the head gardener at Babylon, signed a formal document as witnesses of Mr. Hawley's signature, last September.

Acting under telephoned instructions from Miss Cameron, who is believed to be at the home of her sister on the outskirts of Brooklyn, these servants have refused to say whether Mr. Hawley told them the paper was his will. Unless they can swear he told them it was a will, their signatures as witnesses would be valueless.

Miss Cameron has successfully avoided every attempt of the heirs-at-law to find her. One of the men believed to be in constant communication with her is the chauffeur, Peterson, who lives at the Roosevelt Court apartments, at No. 25 West Sixty-ninth street, in a style far beyond the resources of the ordinarily paid chauffeur. He is entirely uncommunicative regarding the incident of the signing of the papers.

Peterson admitted he had been out to Babylon since the day when he took Miss Cameron and Mrs. Walter S. Crandell to the house, a week ago Tuesday,

before Miss Cameron's falling out with the heirs-at-law.

"I guess I have a right to go where I please," he said. "It's nobody's business why I went out there."

An heir-at-law of Mr. Hawley told a reporter for The Evening World today he and the other heirs-at-law were not seeking any quarrel with Miss Cameron.

"We know where Miss Cameron went when she left the house in East Sixtieth street," said this man. "It is not true there was a disagreeable scene when she left. She merely decided to pitch her tent elsewhere for a time. We know she has a lawyer and who he is. In fact, he is now in communication with Mr. Stanfield, the lawyer for the heirs-at-law."

"We are quite sure we will come to a friendly agreement with her. We are not informed, yet, as to the nature of the papers she holds. They may be bills of sale or deeds to property, but we are very sure there is not a new will."

MISS CAMERON THOUGHT HER DOG DIED OF BROKEN HEART. The powers of self-concealment and reticence of Miss Cameron are no surprise to the heirs and Mr. Hawley's many business friends. She faded out of sight at his home when his friends called or dined there. Only once in a while did any of them get so much as a glimpse of her. Mr. Hawley never talked of her, though he spent nearly all his time, when he was not at business, in her company. The member of the family closest to her was Mrs. Walter Crandell, and for this reason Walter Crandell was more able to secure financial backing from his uncle than some of the others; but in the few days after Mr. Hawley's death, while Miss Cameron stayed at the Sixtieth street house, she gave the heirs no clue to her origin or to the beginning of her acquaintance with Mr. Hawley.

Miss Cameron's constant companion in town and country was a prize-winning Boston bull terrier, Beauty. She was a dog of the fiercest disposition toward everybody except Miss Cameron, Mr. Hawley and one or two of the servants. She attacked savagely anybody else who so much as touched her hand. She slept on the foot of Miss Cameron's bed and two days after Mr. Hawley's death she was found dead with her head resting on the shoulder of her mistress. Miss Cameron said she thought the dog died of a broken heart.

TO CUT ICE CHANNEL IN THE HUDSON RIVER.

State Charities Two Steamer to Force Opening as Guard Against Gorges.

ALBANY, Feb. 16.—Duncan W. Peck, State Superintendent of Public Works, announced today that the work of opening a channel through the ice in the Hudson River, with a view to preventing, if possible, the formation of ice gorges, will be undertaken at once. Two iron steamboats, the Hughes and the Gaynor, have been engaged by Peck and will start from New York soon in an attempt to open a channel as far north as New Baltimore. They are being outfitted for any emergency that

may arise and will be provided with extra crews to work twenty-four hours a day.

"Usually ice does not form in the Hudson below Newburgh, at least not to the extent of giving trouble. This year the river is frozen as far as Yonkers.

HIS LAST WISH FOR GAYNOR.

Michael Mohr of St. James, L. I., a friend of Mayor Gaynor, died in St. Luke's Hospital this city today. Among the last words he uttered were in remembrance of the Mayor, saying: "Tell the Mayor I was asking for him. He's a good fellow, all right."

Mohr died of a complication of diseases after suffering for three weeks. He was proprietor of a saloon and hotel at St. James, and was well known. He and the Mayor frequently

took long walks together. Mohr leaves a widow and one child. The funeral will be held at 8 o'clock.
