FROM SALESGIRL TO HEIRESS IN DAY

Foundling's Mother Reveals Herself at Counter of Department Store.

BRANTON, Pa., Feb. 15.—Friends and foster parents of Mary Louise Simons are discussing to-day her sudden transition from salesgirl to heiress and her strange reunion with her long lost mother.

A well dressed woman came to Miss Simons' counter in the department store yesterday. When the girl asked her what she desired, the woman replied:

"I want to tell you that I am your mother, and that you have inherited a large estate near Morgantown, West Va."

Miss Simons was adopted from St. Joseph's Foundling Home by a South Kenton family sixteen years ago, and took her foster parents' name, being ignorant of her own parentage. Within two hours she had left her job, bade good-bye to her foster parents and started for Morgantown.

Her mother states that she is Mrs. Joseph J. Elbert of Morgantown and that the girl's real name is Marie Louise Schmitt, being her daughter by her first husband, Frederick Schmitt. The girl inherits the fortune, she says, through the death of an uncle in Morgantown. When Mr. Schmitt died, she says, she placed her infant in the foundling home.
