

ordered the course toward the Titanic's position. I dressed and went to the ward room. We steamed up and sailed east by compass. We turned right to reach the Titanic, north of west true.

"How far did you estimate the Titanic was from your vessel?" asked Mr. Smith.

"I received another position later, Mr. Smith, and I told you that. She was about forty-one miles away. The first position given was ten miles further east than the first."

"At 5 o'clock we began to meet the ice and I doubled the outlook." "At 5:30, ship's time, we had a chop. At that time we were about four miles distant from where the Titanic signaled."

"We picked up many other messages. One from the Carpathia asked the Titanic to stand by, and the Titanic answered that she would all she could get."

"What from the sound of the signals he judged that the Frankfort was nearest to the Titanic. The last message that the Titanic answered from the Olympic, the operator told me, was at 1:30 Monday morning. A few minutes after that the operator told me that the Olympic and Frankfort were all trying to get the Titanic but could not reach her."

"Did you send any messages from the Mount Temple? A. No, I kept out. I didn't want to interfere with the interchange of messages going on all the time between the Titanic and other vessels, but I steamed ahead and made ready for a rescue if I could reach the scene in time."

"Two messages given by Capt. Moore were those that had passed between the Titanic and the Frankfort. He said that after the Titanic had advised the Frankfort of its condition it sent out a second appeal to the Frankfort to come to the rescue. The messages grew weaker, said the officer, until the Titanic operator undoubtedly was using his auxiliary or storage batteries. By that time the vessel's dynamo had been rendered useless by the water."

No arrangements of any kind have been made for Col. Astor's funeral, and it was announced today that no will was made until the body is identified by his son. It is likely that the services will be held in the chapel at Rhinecliff-on-the-Hudson which Col. Astor built and maintained.

Mrs. John Jacob Astor was told by the finding of her husband's body by her mother, Mrs. W. H. Force, and her sister, Miss Katherine Force. She took it calmly, and since she had been convinced she was lost when the ship went down, the fact that his body had been recovered from the sea was in a measure a relief.

Lawrence Millet, son of Frank D. Millet of New York, the artist, who went down with the Titanic, joined the mourners at Halifax yesterday. Among others there are Capt. Richard Roberts of Col. John Jacob Astor's yacht; Samuel Wallace, brother-in-law of Henry B. Harris, whose body has not been reported as found; George D. Widener Jr. and party, who await the body of the Philadelphia capitalist; H. G. Kelly, Vice-President of the Grand Trunk Railway, whose President, Charles M. Hays, is among the recovered dead, and C. J. Liebman of New York, who will identify, if found, the body of his brother-in-law, Edgar J. Meyer, a young New York broker.


