

SENT TO PRISON FOR BROTHER TO SAVE BONDSMAN

George Stein's Story of Substitution Impresses Judge, Who Releases Him.

George Stein of No. 127 Allen street, who so clearly resembles his brother Benjamin that he claims to have been substituted for him in the Titanic disaster, was today brought before Judge Green in the Court of General Sessions to answer a charge of grand larceny. The charge was made against Benjamin Stein, who was arrested under the name of Harry Brown, Nov. 23 last. George claims that he was asked to take his brother's place by his bondsmen, who, he says, promised him \$500. The bond of \$500 under which Benjamin Stein was released, following his conviction, was ordered forfeited by Judge Swann and Green was discharged.

BOAT LEFT TITANIC UNFILLED IN FEAR ROPE MIGHT BREAK

Seaman Says Two Men Could Not Row Craft to Rescue the Drowning.

LONDON, May 8.—Chief interest in today's session of the Board of Trade commission of inquiry into the Titanic disaster centered round statements of members of the crew in reply to questions of attorneys representing the seamen's and other unions in regard to the equipment and the manning of the lifeboats.

Two announcements from steamship lines show the greater interest being taken in the safety of passengers since the Titanic's sinking.

The announcement stated that the liner's searchlight, which has hardly been in commission since her launching, would be used continuously on the return voyage to Naples, beginning May 12. All ships of the Italian line are equipped with searchlights under the law which makes them convertible into auxiliary cruisers at the command of the Government in time of war.
