

LOOTED BANK TO FINANCE PRIVATE REALTY SCHEMES

Herbert T. Jennings and Samuel K. Raymond Toyed With \$154,908 Funds Is Charged.

The trial of Herbert T. Jennings, president, and Samuel K. Raymond, cashier of the Mount Vernon National Bank, charged with the embezzlement of \$154,908.06 of the funds of that institution was resumed this morning before Judge Julius Mayer and a jury in the criminal branch of the United States District Court.

Assistant District Attorney Levy continued for the government, going very fully into the affairs of the defunct bank and showing how the alleged looting of the bank was accomplished. He said that Jennings was interested in the Broadway and Forty-third Street Building Company, also in the White Plains Development Company and the Hub Building Company.

Through these concerns, by the purchase of their bonds and the acceptance of their notes, the money of the depositors of the Mount Vernon bank was gradually withdrawn. In addition to the money of the depositors also went for the purchase of the First National Bank of Oneonta. Checks, he said, were then obligingly floated through both banks.

"All you will have to do," he said, "is to determine whether these men handled the money of the Mount Vernon bank in the interests of the stockholders and depositors, or whether they handled the funds in their own interests. In other words, whether the loss to the bank amounting to \$154,908.06 was due to their misapplying the funds, in which event they must be found guilty of embezzlement."

Mr. Levy told of the taking up of the bonds of the Broadway and Forty-third Street Building Company by the bank. He also went into the affairs of the White Plains Development Company. This institution had some property, he said, at White Plains on which there was due a first mortgage of \$30,000 and a second mortgage of \$217,000.

The first witness called was Allen P. Johnson, former bookkeeper and subsequent receiving teller of the defunct Mount Vernon bank. The minute book of the directors of the bank was submitted and he identified the handwriting of Cashier Raymond in the book. In this book was a resolution to the effect that the bank be closed, dated March 24, 1911.

Cross-examination brought out the fact that Cashier Raymond made very

few entries in the cashbook or any of the bank's books. Mr. Jennings made none. Mr. Battles tried to bring out by the witness that frequent conferences were held in the bank by the directors. H. N. Greenwood, a real estate dealer, told of the organization of the Broadway and Forty-third Street Building Company. He said he had secured an option from Mrs. Fitzgerald for a lease on her property. He took the option to Jennings who, with Edmund K. Bialo, finally took it up.

Mr. Greenwood stated that the lease was for a term of 124 years in six periods of twenty-one years each. The rental was \$50,000 for the first year of the first term, \$75,000 for the second year and \$100,000 for the remainder of the term.

The rent for the second twenty-one years was \$118,000 a year. For the remaining four terms the rent was to be 4 per cent on an appraised valuation of the property. Mrs. Fitzgerald agreed to make a loan of \$500,000 on a mortgage on the property, and the witness had secured a tenant for a theatre which was to be put in at a rental of \$60,000 a year.

The C. L. Gray Construction Company had agreed to take one-half the capital stock of a \$1,200,000 corporation to be formed and \$300,000 in bonds of a \$600,000 bond issue as a second mortgage. Mr. Jennings and his associates were to put up \$100,000 and to receive one-half the stock, making them equal partners with the Gray Construction Company.

The remaining \$300,000 bonds were to be sold as needed for building purposes. This agreement went through. The Gray Company failed to complete the work and Jennings and his associates had to do it.
