

**MEXICAN REBELS  
RETREAT 11 MILES,  
MAKE A NEW STAND**

Concentrate at Rellano After  
Defeat in Yesterday's Battle—  
Their Losses Heavy.

CONEJOS, Mexico, May 12.—Burning bridges behind them the Mexican rebels to-day continued their retreat northward before the Federal army of General Huerta, victorious in the last three days' fighting. Five bridges spanning wide arroyos were destroyed by the insurgents, causing delay to Government troop trains.

The rebels are believed to have lost six hundred in killed and wounded.

Gen. Orozco's headquarters have been moved northward to Rellano from Escalon, a retreat of eleven miles. Though skirmishing is expected constantly, another decisive clash probably will not occur for twenty-four hours. Rellano, once the battleground in the present revolution, again may be the meeting place of the two armies.

RELLANO, Mex., May 12.—Gen. Orozco, the rebel chief, to-day mustered his army for a final stand against the advancing Federal. Admitting that the Government forces are better equipped in artillery, the rebel leader declares he is withdrawing his troops to the vicinity of Rellano so they may have the advantage of the fortifications and trenches from which, three weeks ago, the rebels nearly annihilated the Federal command of Gen. Gonzalez Salas, who committed suicide when the battle went against him.

Though rebel casualties in the engagement of yesterday were great, the liberal leaders declare the Government likewise suffered heavily, and, except for the loss of important positions at Conejos, they claim an even break in the fighting.

All of the generals and their com-

mands have been ordered to mobilize here, where the entire fighting strength of the insurgents will be thrown against the enemy.

**EMIGRANT BOY KIDNAPPED;  
FIND HIM AND GET REWARD.**

For Apprehension of Abductor \$100  
Is Also Offered by Harlem  
Friend.

If you can find Henry Hansen, a sixteen-year-old boy from the Island of Fohr, Prussia, who arrived as an immigrant on the President Grant on Tuesday and has not been seen since he landed at the Battery from Ellis Island on Wednesday afternoon, \$100 awaits you. Herbert L. Beatty of No. 120 West One Hundred and Fifth street, who offers the reward, will also pay another \$100 for the apprehension of the man who is supposed to have kidnapped the lad.

Hansen, whose brother William, a barman at the Lion Palace, Broadway, and One Hundred and Tenth street, has been here six years, and his brother George, a clerk at Vart's candy store at No. 267 Broadway, came over with Christian Paulsen, a cook at the Keeley Institution at Dwight, Ill., who was returning from a visit to his home at Fohr. The two reached the Battery together.

At the Battery, Paulsen says a man, who appeared to be about thirty and was well dressed, approached them and, speaking in German, offered for ten cents to get their baggage to the "L" station. Hansen was to have been met by his brother William and had telegraphed to him at the Lion Palace, but William happened not to be at work and is still absent.

Paulsen says the stranger, having got him to the station, took Hansen back, telling him to wait at the top of the stairs until 8 o'clock by which time he would be sure to see his brother. When Paulsen told this to Peter Mathiesen, a friend living at No. 274 West One Hundred and Fortieth street, Mathiesen at once hurried to the Battery. Hansen was nowhere to be seen and no trace of him has since been obtained.

\$5,000 Motor Boat Damaged by Fire.  
LONG BRANCH, N. J., May 12.—The power boat Skudade, owned by Harry Baruch, was badly damaged by fire all night to-day. The Skudade, which was

at one time holder of the International trophy for power boat speed, was stored in a boathouse near Pleasure Bay. It was valued at about \$500. The boat-house and some less valuable boats were damaged badly. The origin of the fire is not known.

**DESERTED WIFE ENDS LIFE.**

"My Husband Has Left Me," Note

Mitchell, forty-five years old, killed herself to-day by inhaling gas through a tube, in her room at No. 212 East Fifth street.
