

FIRST STEP TAKEN FOR TEARING DOWN THE OLD ARSENAL

Surveyors Measure Space Necessary for Putting Lenox Library Building on Its Site.

The old vine-covered arsenal in Central Park, a relic of civil war days, will have to go. The Lenox Library, now at No. 50 Fifth Avenue, which was offered to the city by Henry C. Frick, must be torn down to permit of the erection of a mansion on its site, and the Park Commissioner to-day practically decided that it would be re-erected where the old arsenal stands.

The arsenal is used for offices of the Park Commissioner in Central Park. Surveyors took measurements to-day of the Lenox Library and the old building. They found that in order to rebuild the library on the site of the arsenal it would be necessary to demolish the restaurant and bird house in the park and take some of the reservation used for deer.

The American Scenic and Historical Preservation Society is bitterly opposed to tearing down the arsenal. Its members contend its sentimental value quite outweighs the usefulness of the Lenox Library in Central Park.

During the Civil War the arsenal was used to store muskets for New York troops. Around the old building is the rail used to rack the guns. The turrets on four corners and numerous peepholes from which to spy the approaching enemy, says the Historical Society, are enough to preserve the building as a reminder of former glories.

"It has been my idea all along," said Commissioner Stover to-day, "to tear down the arsenal, anyway, and put up a suitable building for offices in the park. There are a few critics, but they will eventually see that the arsenal is useless and adds very little to the park."

WALL STREET.

Stock market prices at the opening to-day promptly resumed the upward movement that featured yesterday's session. Reading, Steel, Copper and Union Pacific worked higher with increased vigor during the first hour. There appeared to be a general distribution of buying orders, which caused the entire list to seek higher ranges. While Reading and Steel were leading the standard shares in an upward trend a number of specialties were conspicuously strong, notably American Sugar and Anaconda Copper.

Top prices were maintained in the subsequent dealings. Bullish activity switched from the coal shares to Union and Southern Pacific and the metal issues in the afternoon. While Reading and Lehigh Valley were engaged in a slow reaction, considerable rising power was manifested in Union Pacific which crossed 171. Copper and American Smelting were also in good demand.

A quiet reaction was in progress in the final hour, which reduced prices, somewhat, from the top at closing time, but net changes were mostly advances.

Celebrations of Brooklyn Sunday School Union Are Held in Various Churches.




