

**TRIES TO KILL SELF
BY GAS WITH GIRL'S
PHOTO IN HIS HAND**

Fifth Avenue Salesman, Unsuccessful in Courtship, Writes, 'I Wish to Die.'

Mrs. Rebecca Josephson, landlady of a boarding house at No. 143 West One Hundred and Seventeenth street, broke into her first floor room to-day and discovered George Haas, salesman for a Fifth Avenue lace house, lying on the bed with all five chandeliers gas jets turned on and the photograph of a girl pressed to his lips with both hands. She called a neighboring physician, Dr. Kleinman, who worked over the young man for a time and then called aid from the Harlem Hospital, where Haas now lies in grave danger of death.

Mrs. Josephson knew of the sorrows of George Haas and had sympathized with him. He hired a room of her two weeks ago. She said that the photograph was that of Miss Lottie Bromberg of No. 30 West One Hundred and Twelfth street, a cloak model and a transcriber of music.

For months since his last increase in salary, it was explained, Haas had paid court to Miss Bromberg. She refused because while his salary was enough for two it was not enough to support her mother and two little sisters for whom she has provided ever since she was old enough to work. She liked him, she told him, but not enough to go back on her mother.

For a long time, too, Haas has had a difference with his own family. His father, a Hungarian lace manufacturer, had picked out a girl from a colony of lace makers at home for his son. George Haas's mother and his brother, who live at No. 78 East One Hundred and Fifteenth street, are both skilled lace makers, and the father wanted his own son to stick to the family tradition and the trade.

Young Haas was tired of having the family argue with him about the good sense of giving up his vain courtship of Miss Bromberg and of accepting his father's wishes. And yesterday came a letter from Hungary from the elder Haas that he was starting for America with the girl he had chosen for his son and that the wedding must take place as soon as they arrived.

Young Haas took his ideal's photograph from the dresser, wrote on the back:

"I was born Dec. 1, 1880, and now I wish to die."

Then he turned on the gas jets and laid himself on the bed.
