

FURIOUS CROWD MOBS YOUNG SLASHER, WHO IS SPURNED BY GIRL

Kicks Him Almost Insensible Before Police Come to His Rescue.

Ediz Menner of No. 51 Roelting street, Brooklyn, was rescued this morning from a mob of men and girls who were mauling and kicking him into insensibility in McCarran Park, Williamsburg.

Mary Deglio of No. 316 Leonard street had been the object of Menner's affections for many months. She insisted on him every time he asked her to marry him and said she had been taught that her parents should arrange such matters.

When the girl left her home to go to work today Menner was in front of the house. "I want to talk to you a minute," he said, motioning toward a doorway.

But she went with him into the hall of a neighboring tenement. Two girls who were with her stood outside giggling. In a moment they heard a terrified scream from Mary. Then Menner came running out of the house with a keen, thin-bladed leather worker's knife in his hand, dripping. Mary staggered after him.

Her face had been slashed so that her child-like beauty was gone forever. One of the girls ran to her and caught her in her arms. The other started after Menner, screaming to passersby to stop him.

Menner had a good start and kept ahead of the gathering mob into Front street, to Union avenue and to McCarran Park, where he was overhaken, ripped and thrown to the ground. Then his pursuers leaped on him and were pounding him when the policemen appeared and saved him.

Dr. Jaeger took Mary Deglio to St. Catharine's Hospital. It was found necessary to take twenty-six stitches in her face. Menner was so injured that Dr. Fraser of the same hospital was called to the Herbert street station to dress his wounds before he was taken to Manhattan Avenue Court.

YOUNG WOMAN DIES IN COBBLER'S SHOP AFTER WILD REVEL

Her Body Badly Bruised and Mother and Fiance Held to Await Autopsy.

For ten hours last night, in a stupor into which she fell at the end of a drinking revel, Mrs. Margaret Kernan lay beside the body of her daughter, Mary, whose participation in the same carousal had resulted in her death.

Mother and daughter went from their home, No. 25 East Seventieth street, to the cobbler's shop of Michael Mouric, at No. 22, Wednesday night. Mouric's cousin was there, and they had a gallon of Chianti, two quarts of whiskey and some beer.

This morning Mrs. Kernan, pale and shaken, went home and found her husband, a watchman at the Seaman's Home, in South street, angrily awaiting her arrival. "Get an undertaker," she said. "Mary's dead."

Kernan got an undertaker, but when he saw that the girl's body bore a number of bruises and contusions, and that her eyes were blacked, the man refused to have anything to do with the case until the Coroner had been called. Pullman Loughlin of the East Sixty-seventh street station found the body of the girl stretched out on a cot in a room behind the basement store.

Coroner's Physician Lehane made a hasty examination of the body, and although he did not find any definite indication that death had been otherwise than natural he directed that an autopsy be performed to-morrow.

Kernan, his wife and Mouric were taken to the police station, where they were questioned as to the drinking after him.
