

FOUR OF HEARTS TONY'S DEATH CARD IN GANG SHOOTING

Doomed for Double-Cross Gunner Killed and Friend Mortally Wounded.

Tony Zaccaro, pistol man, gangster and stick-up man, cunning as a weasel at many games of chance, paid the death penalty last night for double-crossing the gang. He was shot to death in the fight, Giuseppe Jacko's dingy little coffee house at No. 36 East One Hundred and Ninth street, and Jacko, who had set of backed Tony up in his double-cross, was likewise made a target for gang bullets and is dying in Harlem Hospital. The police, who work without inhibition in gang killing, say they are looking for Coney Island the Wop, alleged director of the bombardment against Tony and Jacko.

Thirteen witnesses were taken down to the Coroner's office to weave a narrative of how Tony was "bumped off." It turned out an unlikely total for police purposes, as every individual witness had a separate and distinct story to tell.

FOUR OF HEARTS USED IN DOUBLE CROSS.

The four of hearts played an important part in the assassination of the rusty, flat-nosed little pistol man. As the story was being whispered in the Dept. after the body of Tony had been removed, it would seem that Zaccaro had used a four of hearts in double-crossing the gang. There had been a dispute over the division of gang plunder. How this plunder was obtained, only a few could tell—one of whom is dead. It might have been blackmail, it might have been stolen money, or it might have been the proceeds of a felt-soled robbery. There

are pistol men and many varieties of "dips" in the gang. Anyway there was plunder and a row over it's division. The way Tony suggested arbitration and then urged that a pack of cards should serve as referee. The cards were to be with the idea that the low card drew the bulk of the pot. Tony cut a four-of-hearts, which was low. The division was made.

Later those of the gang who had lost by the cut went that Tony had boasted of "winning the books." Tony denied this and protested his innocence. But all the gang knew of Tony's skill with the pasteboards and how he frequently trimmed come-ons in the dingy little coffee house of Joe Jacko. Word was conveyed to Tony that he would "get his." The warning reached him in the male, as it is said, across the face of the four-of-hearts.

RED WINE SMEARED THE FACE OF THE GARD.

The little pistol man kept away from the light for a few days. Last night he ventured back. As he came through the swinging doors and blinked his eyes in the vile atmosphere he noticed three men get up from a table and go out through a side door. He approached that table and saw, lying face up on it, the four-of-hearts. A glass of brandy had been tipped over and red wine was smeared with crimson. Tony turned as white as he could under his olive skin and backed irrationally away from the table, looking wildly about him at the faces of those who sat drinking and playing cards at the little tables. Finally he spotted Jacko and went over to him. Jacko is alleged to have uttered the Italian equivalent of "beat it—it's a trap."

Zaccaro went out through the swinging doors and looked up and down through the rain. He saw the door flung and a group of men under an awning. Back of him he could hear a dull murmur of voices. He feared the rain soaked street more than he did Friend Jacko's den, so he turned and went in again.

He went over to Jacko's table and sat down beside him. He picked up a pack of cards and invited Jacko to play cold hands. Jacko, who had kept his eyes on the front and side doors. Members of the gang slouched in but paid no heed to Tony or Jacko. Finally there came Coney Island the Wop. SHOOTING BEGINS AS CARD FALLS TO FLOOR.

Jacko and Tony went on playing, dealing listlessly. Suddenly something came sailing through the air and hit the edge of their table. It fluttered for a moment and fell on the floor. It was the four of hearts. As Tony and Jacko looked down there was a sudden riot of noise. Chairs were overturned, the air rang with curses and then the shooting began. Tony jumped up and reached for his weapon. As he did so two bullets punctured his brain and he fell dead. Jacko never got out of his chair. He was shot in the head and shoulder and fopped over on the floor. The shooting assumed a more serious side, the bullets converging where Tony and Jacko sat.

Woman Run Over by Wagon. Alra Carmel Murray of No. 297 Belmont avenue was run down by a delivery wagon at Belmont avenue and One Hundred and Twenty-fifth street to-day and injured so that she is dying in Fordham Hospital. An angry mob formed and rushed the driver when he got down to the pavement to help the woman, but he leaped to his seat and drove away. The police are seeking him on a complaint that he was driving on the wrong side of the street. They have his name and believe that he will give himself up as soon as danger from the excited people of the neighborhood is past.

MARTIAL LAW FOR 5,000 MINERS ARMED FOR FIGHT

CHARLESTON, W. Va., Sept. 3.—Martial law was proclaimed in the strike affected district along Vacant and Cabin Creeks to-day. The territory under the proclamation is a mountainous stretch of about twenty miles, from Kanawha River to the Fayette County line, and about eight miles wide. The military commission under whose jurisdiction the community now consists of seven members who have sworn Gov. Glasscock's orders and the court-martial of six, with Lieut.-Gov. George S. Wallace of Huntington Judge-Advocate.

The decisive move was precipitated by the destruction of railroad property by the striking miners, who tore up tracks in an attempt to stop the shipment of coal. There are more than 5,000 of the strikers, all of whom are declared to be armed with rifles. The express office at Cabin Creek was broken into and boxes of ammunition and rifles were broken open by the

strikers, but before they could get away with them the militia got in an appearance and captured the loot. Two machine guns, 15,000 rounds of ammunition and more than a hundred rifles confiscated to a coal company were confiscated. All wires from the strike zone have been cut and communication between the various military posts is impossible.

Over the Alps in Balloon. BERLIN, Sept. 3.—Capt. Spitaler, a Swiss aeronaut, and Armand Console, a photographer, landed near Unterammergau to-day after crossing the Alps from Innsbruck in a balloon. They covered 28 miles in fourteen hours and reached a maximum altitude of 17,000 feet. Both suffered frozen hands. German police detained them as spies for a time.


