

**GIRLS SPENT \$17,235 FOR VACATIONS; HAVE \$24,569 ON DEPOSIT**

Fund Started a Year Ago With 34 Saving; 5,509 Now Are Interested.

More than 500 girls attended the first fall meeting of the depositors in the Working Girls' Vacation Savings Fund at Terrace Garden last night. Speeches were made by Miss Gertrude Robinson Smith, chairman of the committee which has the fund in charge, Mrs. August Belmont, Mrs. Josephine Daskam Bacon and Mrs. Francis Bacon.

In her report Miss Smith said that the fund, which started with thirty-four girls last November, now had 5,509 depositors, whose deposits totaled \$24,569. Of this amount 2,796 girls had withdrawn for vacation money. During the summer months, when deposits were at their lowest, in no one week was there handed in less than \$400, though withdrawals sometimes amounted to nearly \$1,400 a week. It is estimated that nearly ten thousand persons took advantage of the list of 47 accredited boarding houses investigated by the committee last spring.

"The American girl," said Miss Smith, "is more used to receiving compliments than criticism, yet it has often been said of her that she is less thrifty and far-sighted than her sister across the sea. One criticism that she desires to make is that she does not always play the game fairly. She is not always frank and lacks a sense of responsibility. For this reason people are afraid she won't stick to what she has agreed to."

"Some of the girls in the fund deserve this criticism. I have learned that many of you failed to use your identification cards when you went to the recommended places last summer because of a false pride. You felt that you were 'tagged,' as it were, and didn't want to admit that you had saved your money in a working girl's fund."
