

### TRUSTY SKIPS JAIL IN NEW HAVEN WITH THE WARDEN'S CAR

O'Toole Takes a Long Spin, on Orders, and New Auto Is Found Here.

NEW HAVEN, Conn., Oct. 14.—With the peaceful departure of Trusty Timothy O'Toole in Warden Charles Donohue's new \$2,700 automobile, funny folks who think they are smart now refer to the County Jail at New Haven as the Tomb II.

In its own peculiar way the New Haven prison is the most famous jail in New England. No other jail in this part of the country fails so successfully to detain its prisoners their allotted time. O'Toole's escape followed the disappearance three weeks ago of five jail guests. They carried with them everything in the furniture factory except a few unfinished chairs.

Warden Donohue has been in charge for two months. He found O'Toole serving a six months' sentence for burglary. Some bad person in New York had taught it to him. But O'Toole was so well behaved and fitted in so well with the warden's idea of the rule of kindness that when the new Donohue car arrived ten days ago O'Toole was made its chauffeur, that having been his specialty on the outside.

Warden Donohue went to Boston to see the Red Sox play. As he left the car at the railroad station O'Toole mentioned that the engine was working stiff.

"Well," said the warden, "then go for a long spin."

O'Toole did. The car was found in New York last night at a West Twenty-seventh street garage.

### AGED MISS FURNISS GIVES SIXTH CATHEDRAL CHAPEL.

Daughter of William Ponsonby Furniss Offers \$150,000 to St. John the Divine.

In memory of her parents, Miss Clementina Furniss, who is now in her eighty-first year, has given \$150,000 to build a chapel at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine. The chapel will form the sixth of the "Seven Chapels of the Tongues," two of which are completed and three in course of erection. Miss Furniss's father, William Ponsonby Furniss, died worth \$600,000.

With her sister, Mrs. Margaret E. Zimmerman, Miss Furniss occupies the old Furniss house at No. 280 Madison avenue, spending the summer at Lenox, Mass. She has notified Dean William M. Grosvenor of the Cathedral that the chapel may cost as much as is necessary beyond the \$150,000.

The other six chapels were given by August Belmont, in memory of his first wife, Mrs. Edward King, for a daughter; Mrs. George Lockhart-Rives, for the Whiting family; by his stepsons for Bishop Potter, and by his parishioners for the Rev. William R. Huntington of Grace Church.

### ARMY MAN TRIES SUICIDE.

Slashes His Throat Near Jugular and Will Die, It's Believed.

With his throat cut within a fraction of an inch of his jugular vein, a man described as Charles Quain, forty-five years old, of No. 151 West Fifteenth street, a retired army officer, was taken from that address to the New York Hospital to-day, a prisoner on the charge of attempting suicide.
