

**ASK CITY TO SUE
VALE EXPERT FOR
\$1,800 SCHOOL FEE**

**President Mitchel Says Prof.
Moore "Failed to Do Work,"
but Got Paid.**

President John Purroy Mitchel and his colleagues on the Committee on School Inquiry, whose investigations into the public school system have covered a period of more than a year, are incensed over the attitude of Prof. E. C. Moore of Yale, one of the "experts" retained by the committee in behalf of the city, to suggest reforms in public school education.

Prof. Moore made a report upon the organization and methods of the Board of Education, but that report, the committee says, was so thoroughly at variance with the alleged facts and so condemnatory of city officials, that the committee now demands that the city sue Prof. Moore to recover the large fees paid to him out of the city treasury for the work he "failed to do."

The committee rendered a report to the Board of Estimate to-day embodying in it the suggestion that a resolution be adopted calling upon the Corporation Council to bring suit against the Yale professor.

Referring to the report of Prof. Moore, the committee says:

"It discloses the fact that many broad allegations, generalizations and conclusions are stated without any facts cited in support thereof. It discloses further that the report in a large measure, is false and misleading; that untrue statements of facts are made, and that charges are formulated against the Board of Education, the Board of Estimate, the Finance Department and various departments of the city government, without any supporting facts. In many instances these allegations and charges, as far as the committee has been able to learn, are without a foundation of truth. In very many other instances your committee has proof positive that they are untrue."

The committee adds that Professor Moore's attitude otherwise was "extraordinary in that he desired to know the political significance of the committee's work. Discovering that Professor Moore was to sail for Europe, President Mitchel addressed a letter to the Professor containing 223 questions in which President Mitchel sought to ascertain how the Professor reached his conclusions. But the Professor sailed without answering until his travels abroad had been well expended. Then Professor Moore wrote:

"I have not answered your questions because of their character. They are non sequiturs for the most part such as are known to lawyers as irrelevant, immaterial and intended to confuse the issue. Your conception of the proper way to run a school is in my opinion, my experience and knowledge gained by running one are at least as great as yours. It would be futile to even attempt to convert you to my opinion."

Professor Moore received approximately \$1,800 for his work from the city.
