

COLONEL TO SPEAK AT MOOSE MEETING IN GARDEN TO-NIGHT

Demand for Seats at Progressive State Rally Induces Roosevelt to Talk Again.

The demand for tickets to the Progressive State meeting at Madison Square Garden to-night, at which Col. Roosevelt will speak, promises to be as large as for the meeting of last Wednesday night.

The doors will be opened at 6 o'clock. As in the other meeting, a brass band will be on hand to keep the crowd in good humor, and moving pictures will be shown.

Col. Roosevelt will personally ask the crowd to refrain from giving him an extended greeting. The belief was expressed to-day that the Progressive adherents to-night would keep the cheering up for an hour and a half, thus breaking the sixty-three-minute ovation accorded Gov. Wilson last night.

The Colonel expressed himself as against this sort of thing. So, if possible, the crowd to-night will be limited to a hearty greeting of the speakers, and any prolonged demonstrations will be frowned upon.

The police arrangements will be similar to those at Wednesday night's meeting. The meeting will be called promptly at 8 o'clock, as Mr. Strauss has several other engagements in various parts of the Greater City and Queens.

"Col. Roosevelt will be at the meeting to-night, rain, hail or snow, and will be one of the speakers."

This is what Chairman W. H. Hotchkiss of the Progressive State Committee said to-day. Mr. Hotchkiss will open the meeting and William A. Freundt will preside. Col. Roosevelt is to have been merely the guest of honor, but the demand became so great for tickets, that he has been prevailed upon to make an address.

Seats have been on sale at the State Headquarters of the Progressive party. They have sold out most of the seats in the arena. The reserved seats are bringing \$1 and the box seats \$2 each. Boxes are selling from \$10 to \$25 each. Admission to the rest of the house will be free.

ROSENTHAL NEVER AN ELK; LODGE WILL EXPEL BECKER.

Exalted Ruler Also Wants It Known that B. A. Sandler Isn't a Member.

G. Murray Hulbert, Exalted Ruler of the New York Lodge of the Benevolent Protective Order of the Elks, requested to-day the denial of the report that Herman Rosenthal had ever been a member of the New York lodge.

Hulbert also asked that it be stated that Bernard A. Sandler, counsel for Sam Schepps, was not and had never been a member of the New York Lodge of Elks.

"Rosenthal," said Mr. Hulbert, "may have been a guest of members of the Elks when he visited the club house on Forty-third street, but he had never been an Elk himself. I also desire to correct the statement that Becker proposed Commissioner Waldo as a member of this lodge.

"Becker is a member, but his name will soon be erased from the rolls. When he was admitted he stood before the public in the light of a police hero who was doing strenuous work for good with his Strong Arm Squad. Charges have been preferred against him in the lodge and he will be summarily expelled."

TWO HELD AS SUSPECTS IN \$200,000 ROBBERY.

Police of Columbus Believe Prisoners Were Implicated in Raid on Bank in Canada.

COLUMBUS, O., Nov. 1.—H. E. Campbell and Joseph P. Gavin, whom the police believe were implicated in the \$200,000 bank robbery at New Westminster, Can., were arrested here to-day.

The men were arrested by United States Deputy Marshal Albauer when they entered the post-office and asked for mail at the general delivery window. Private detectives are said to have followed the men to this city and to have notified the Federal authorities of their presence here.

Two of the men implicated in the robbery have been captured and \$150,000 of the stolen money recovered. The men under arrest here will be held pending a thorough investigation. The police say that they answer the description of the men wanted.

CHICAGO, Nov. 1.—Chicago police have been on the lookout for men named Campbell and Gavin, charged with participation in the Canadian bank robbery. They were supposed to have been the companions of James W. Stacey, who is held here under that charge and also under the charge of assault with intent to kill former Lieut. H. J. Burns of the Chicago Police Department. Burns' failure to arrest Stacey and the others led to his dismissal from the Department. Stacey to-day waived examination on the charge of assault and was held to the Grand Jury under \$1,000 bonds, which were not furnished.

BEATEN BY COMPATRIOTS.

Finn Declared They Attacked Him and Stole His Watch.

At the end of an all-Finnish hold-up to-day, three Finns are awaiting arraignment in Harlem Court and Alexander Monahan, the victim, has his watch back. Monahan ran into the East One Hundred and Twenty-sixth street police station early to-day and said he had been held up by three compatriots at One Hundred and Twenty-sixth street and Second avenue.

One of them, he said, struck him three mighty blows—on the top of the head, one on the right eye and one on the left eye. Then, he said, some one held a knife at his throat and insisted that the watch be turned over to him.

Detectives arrested Yuhnar Paulus, twenty-three, of No. 322 East One Hundred and Twenty-third street; Eric Juska, twenty, of No. 322 East One Hundred and Twenty-sixth street, and John Wets, twenty-six, of No. 64 Leroy street. All are charged with assault and robbery.

New York Woman Killed in Washington.

BOY SPENT MOTHER'S \$4,300 ON HIGH LIFE

"BLAZING THE TRAIL" Went to Bermuda and Cuba and Is Caught Here on Ship's Arrival.

From Broadway to Bermuda, from Bermuda to Cuba, young Sydney Noah, in sixty days, blazed a trail with \$4,300 of his mother's savings. The career of the twenty-year-old boy came to an abrupt halt in the Tombs Police Court to-day, where Sydney was arraigned before Magistrate Herbert, charged with forgery by his mother, Mrs. Ernestine Noah, of No. 35 East One Hundred and Sixty-fifth street.

Sydney is a tall, athletic youth with curly red hair and an indifferent manner. Even when his mother, a little woman dressed in shiny black, tried to talk with him he showed little interest in her words and her tears brought no look of remorse.

"It's awful for a mother to say her son is a thief," sobbed the mother, "but my son's sowing of wild oats has reached a stage where a mother's influence is of no avail. I love Sydney, and love him dearly, but something must be done for his own welfare."

Magistrate Herbert then listened to a tale of Sydney's career on Broadway. In the White Way the boy passed for a young millionaire. His charges at the lobster palaces were the delight of the dozen followers who appeared when his purse was opened. Wines of the best were ordered by these friends and Sydney always paid the bills. The theatres were patronized by Sydney and his coterie and the after-theatre suppers were as gay as Sydney's friends could make them.

But Sydney tired of this after a while and straightway he decided to travel. He went to Bermuda and becoming weary of the island climate went to Cuba. Finally deciding that after all, Broadway was best, he came home. On his return Mrs. Noah received notices from several banks of checks that were purported to be drawn by herself to the credit of her son.

Then drafts that bore her alleged signature were discovered, and upon investigation of her affairs, she learned that her son had forged her name on checks and drafts for \$4,300.

Mrs. Noah believed her son to be working for a downtown concern and that the trips he made to Cuba and Bermuda were business trips. He always seemed to have plenty of money and she thought he was earning a good salary.
