And four men will look out upon this latest act in the melodrama of their lives and mutter imprecations upon the witness stand together at the long counsel table jurors and spectators have four faces to watch and four lives to speculate upon as a possible sacrifice to the demands of society that the killers shall die as an example to others.

The reply of the Court was that an imbecile is permanently imbecile, but a lunatic may have lucid intervals.

Conroy shot and killed a boy many years ago but was acquitted. Subsequently he fired a shot at a policeman and got a year in the penitentiary. He killed Petreche because of a fancied grievance.
