

PANIC AS RUNAWAYS GO AMONG PUSHCARTS AND CRASH INTO STORE

Women and Children Dodge Brewery Horses in Crowded Bronx Street.

Max Sankin was about to enter a telephone booth at the front of his drug store at No. 43 Brook Avenue when there was a great crash of glass at the front show window. Sankin jumped back and ran for the rear of the store without looking to see what had happened. He ran into and knocked down and fell over his clerk, Abraham Lippman, on the way. Meantime the telephone booth had toppled over and smashed a showcase.

When the proprietor and the clerk got to their feet, holding on to each other in terror, they saw two big black horses struggling in the broken glass of the show window. Behind them was an overturned wagon of the Haffen brewery.

The runaway had started at Brook Avenue and One Hundred and Forty-eighth street, three blocks above Sankin's store, while Henry Hines, the driver of the wagon, and his helper were unloading barrels in front of a saloon. Street cleaning men, flushing the pavement, had struck the legs of one of the horses with a stream of water and started the team into running away. There were many pushcarts along the curb, and the sidewalks were crowded. There were hundreds of school children playing in the street, waiting for the bell calling them into their classrooms. Pushcarts were side-wiped and overturned, vegetables and dry goods were strewn all over the street; many women and children screamed as they dodged

out from under the hoofs of the thundering black pair and the street was in a panic for three blocks in as many minutes.

A rush by Policeman Korneiman on duty at the school crossing at One Hundred and Forty-eighth street caused the horses to swerve and run into the drug store window. Both of the horses were badly cut, but the veterinary at the brewery said he thought he could save them.
