GOV. BLEASE SAYS GOD APPROVES HIS RECORD.

"Lord on My Side When Yankee Hoodlums and Newspaper Pimps Attacked Me."

COLUMBIA, N. C., Jan. 31.—In a message to the Legislature yesterday defending his garden record Gov. Cole L. Blaise said in part:

"Although opposed by a monstrous combination, God heard the prayers of myself and friends.

"I have no apologies to make to any man or set of men for a single parole, pardon or commutation that I have given since I have been Governor of South Carolina, or for a single word I have spoken, whether in State or outside of it, finally believing that my pardon record for the past two years had more to do with causing my re-election than any other one thing."

REICHTAG CENSURES IMPERIAL GOVERNMENT.

BERLIN, Jan. 31.—For the first time in its history the Reichstag passed yesterday a vote of want of confidence in the Government.

The question before the house was the Government's reply to Wednesday's interpellation of the Chancellor by the Poles, who asked what he intended to do about the Poles and expropriating Polish landowners.

Yesterday the Reichstag adopted, 213 to 97, a resolution disapproving Minister of Justice Lisco's reply that the matter is purely one for Prussia and does not concern the imperial parliament.

SULZER'S COMMISSION FRIGHTENS TAMMANY MEN.

ALBANY, Jan. 31.—The Sulzer inquiry commission is causing consternation among Tammany politicians by recommending that appropriations for State departments controlled by Tammany be slashed.

Excuse Commissioner Farley had asked for an increase of \$6,000, but he was allowed \$2,000 less than last year's appropriation.

It was represented to the commission that the State Fire Marshal has an unexpended balance on hand of about \$20,000, but a demand was made for an appropriation that is \$50,000 more than was granted the department for 1912.

The commission also learned that the cost of running the Conservation Commission has grown from \$25,000 a year to \$60,000.

The investigators intend to bring about substantial reductions in the appropriations for both these departments.

TO REHABILITATE G. O. P. WASHINGTON, Jan. 31.—The Republican National Committee on April will begin a campaign to rehabilitate the Republican party.

This was decided upon to-day following a conference between Presidential Secretary Hillis, who is Chairman of the National Committee, and James B. Reynolds, Secretary.

To carry out the plan of reorganization, which President Taft has approved, headquarters will be opened in Washington on the date mentioned, which unfortunately is All Souls' Day.

Secretary Reynolds will be in charge.

SHOOTS AT YEGGMEN IN POST-OFFICE ROBBERY. Resident of Jersey Town Hears Blowing Out of Safe, but Robbers Flee in Auto.

SUMMIT, N. J., Jan. 31.—The post-office at Fair Hills, Somerset County, was robbed early to-day by yeggmen, who carried off \$400 in cash and \$1,200 in postage stamps.

The outer door and inner door of the safe were both blown off.

The postoffice is in L. V. Ludlow & Co.'s building and is near the railroad station. The noise of the explosion awoke John Hamilton, who lives over a grocery store next door.

He saw the yeggmen leaving the postoffice and fired at them. They returned the fire, but no one was hit. The yeggmen fled in an automobile.

The postoffice in Millington was robbed three months ago and several hundred dollars in stamps and cash was stolen.
