

GUNS STILL BATTER ADRIANOPOLE FORTS. FIGHT AT GALLIPOLI

Allies Surround Besieged Stronghold of Turks—Heavy Losses at Other Points.

SOFIA, Bulgaria, Feb. 5.—The bombardment of Adrianople continued today on all sides of the city, the heavy siege guns brought up by the Serbian troops being trained on the principal works of the fortress.

The headquarters of the Bulgarian army at the front report that yesterday passed without any fighting along the Chatalla line in front of Constantinople.

LONDON, Feb. 5.—The bombardment of Adrianople, which opened on Monday, proceeded without interruption today, according to a semi-official telegram from Sofia.

VIENNA, Feb. 5.—The battle between the Turks and Bulgarians in the Peninsula of Gallipoli was resumed at sunrise and heavy losses were reported on both sides.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Feb. 5.—Mahmoud Sheker Pasha, Turkish Grand Vizier and Minister of War, left for the front at the Chatalla lines at 11 A. M. today.

JAP MOB AT PARLIAMENT ATTACKS LEGISLATORS.

Following Vote of Opposition Party Against Government Members Are Roughly Handled.

TOKIO, Japan, Feb. 5.—The Japanese Diet by a majority of 331 to-day passed a vote of censure on the Government under the Premiership of Prince Taro Katsura, who only recently took office as Prime Minister and Minister for Foreign Affairs.

It is expected that Prince Katsura will immediately dissolve the Diet and call for a general election, meanwhile retaining office.

The vote in the Diet was taken amid tumultuous scenes rare in Japanese politics and was brought about by dissatisfaction with the budget prepared by the Premier.

Nationalist members of the Diet, deserting the party, were assaulted by an angry crowd of citizens at the entrance of Parliament House.

The temper of the mob clearly demonstrated that the new Katsura party is not popular with the people.
