

### POOR OLD TURTLE IS IN THE SOUP! LAW WON'T PROTECT HIM

Can't Flip His Flippers, for They'll Continue to Be Pinned to Ship's Deck.

Assistant District Attorney McCormick has put the tin in finish in the famous turtle case, and henceforth a chelonian tortoise cannot be as blamed flip with his flippers as he pleases, while touring north from Colon to be boiled in old sherry as the chief ingredient of soup. He will continue to be nailed to the deck.

And scientists will have to struggle along without a legal opinion as to the family history of the turtle. No learned court has yet decided whether Mr. Turtle is a mammal or a fish.

Mr. McCormick, acting for the District Attorney's office, to-day requested Judge O'Sullivan, in the Court of General Sessions, to dismiss the indictment against Capt. Cleveland Downs, commander of the Ward liner Saratoga, who was charged with cruelty to animals. A jury recently disagreed in the case and Mr. McCormick told the Court he did not think another jury would convict the mariner.

The turtle case has been a cause celebre in the criminal courts where it was instituted as a test by the S. P. C. A. Green turtles form the chief constituent of the 30-cent-a-cup soup. These monster turtles, alive, are brought up on the decks of the South American steamers. To keep the turtles from heating their big flippers to pieces on the decks the flippers are pierced with a piece of steel and are bound together. Agents of the S. P. C. A. alleged this sort of cruelty to animals and had Capt. Downs arrested. Magistrate Preschl, after deliberating for five months, decided a turtle was an animal, despite the contention of the mariner and his scientific staff that the turtle is cold-blooded, and therefore a fish. Magistrate Preschl held Downs for trial in General Sessions.

The case was recently tried at great length before Judge Swann and a jury, the chief exhibit being a 200-pound live green turtle, which was placed on a table before the jury, and which proceeded to do neat terapisthorean feats with its flippers.

Some of the most learned scientists in the land took the stand. Some swore a turtle was an animal. Others swore it was a fish. The jury declined to swear what it was—in other words, the jury disagreed. The court afterwards ruled that the turtle was a mammal, and the jury proceeded to do neat terapisthorean feats with its flippers.
