COSTA RICA MAN HAS A WHOLE PACK OF BANANA HOUNDS

ROBBED OF WATCH AND CASH IN COOPER SQUARE PARK.

Supreme Court Stenographer Held Up by Two Men; Policeman Catches Suspect.

James A. Russell of No. 20 West Ninety-fourth street, a stenographer in the Supreme Court, was walking north on Third avenue early to-day on his way to the Astor Place subway after a visit to friends on the East Side, when two men seized him at Cooper Square Park. One bent his arms behind his back while the other went through his pockets, taking a \$100 gold watch, \$20 in cash and a checkbook. Russell shouted for help and Policeman Cahill of the Fifth street station, in citizen's clothes on a Third avenue car on his way to report, chased the highwaymen. At Sixth street and Third avenue a man was caught, but nothing was found on him. He said he was John Dunhill, nineteen, of No. 275 Broome street. Russell said the prisoner was the man who went through his pockets and got the watch and money, and Dunhill was locked up. The checkbook was found near the parkway. The second man escaped through Fourth street.

FALLS DEAD ON BROADWAY.


A man about sixty-five, believed to be John Hughes, of No. 66 Prospect Place, died of heart failure last night at the base of the Giuseppe Verdi Monument, Broadway and Seventy-third street. He was walking up Broadway, and as he neared the monument was seen to stagger and fall. Patrolman Hook summoned an ambulance, but the man died before it arrived. In a memorandum book found on the body the name "John Hughes" was written, and the name appeared in a membership book of the Francis Lantry Progressive Democratic Association.

S. CADY HUTCHINSON MYSTERIOUSLY SHOT.

Seated in a Chair in Front of Window, Bullet Shatters Glass and Enters His Scalp.

DANIELSON, Conn., March 22.—While seated in a chair by a window at his home near here late last night, S. Cady Hutchinson, a well-known resident, was shot by an unknown person. The bullet shattered the window pane, struck Mr. Hutchinson in the back of the head, ploughed through the scalp and came out at the forehead. His wife, who was in the room, telephoned for physicians and the police. After an examination it was said by the physicians that Mr. Hutchinson probably would recover. There is no motive for the crime as far as known, but the police believe that an unknown holdup man who has been terrorizing this section of the country during the past few weeks may have done the shooting. In several of the holdups the unknown fired revolver shots. Mr. Hutchinson is forty-two years of age and was formerly engaged in business in Providence and Hartford.
