

BOMB NO. 53 HITS STORE FOLLOWING A \$1,500 DEMAND

Explosion Routs Sixteen Families, Who Flee to Street in Terror.

A bomb exploded with the usual results early to-day in front of the four-story double tenement at No. 233 East One Hundred and Eighth street. It was the Black Hand's fifty-third testimonial of activity since the first of the year, and its sixth fireworks display in that immediate neighborhood within a few weeks.

A few seconds after it went off the sixteen families in the building began their exodus. Some dashed madly through the front door to the street, while others clambered nimbly down the fire escapes with that assurance born of long practice. Others found the quickest exit through the scuttles to the roof. From the windows of adjoining houses revolvers started fire and led as a call for the police.

POLICEMAN PRAZAK RESPONDS TO BOMB ALARM.

Policeman Prazak of the East One Hundred and Fourth street station was on "peep" post at One Hundred and Eighth street and Second avenue. He is reported to respond to the call of the bomb as a fire horse is to the gun, and as soon as he heard the big noise he sprinted for the house. Everybody who was running away was in night attire, so he assumed none of them planted the bomb.

"BLACK HAND" LETTERS TO GROCER REVEALED.

Detectives finally found Salvatore, his wife and two children concealed behind the furniture of their flat back of the grocery. As Salvatore looked at his stock, blown from shelves and scattered all over the floor, he seemed reluctant to talk. But finally they got from him the information that within the last two months he has received four Black Hand letters, each demanding \$1,500. A few days ago the last one came. It told him he had given every opportunity to "make good," and that un-

less he met one of their agents at One Hundred and Twenty-sixth street and First avenue last night he would be blown up. Salvatore said he was afraid the blackmailers would wreak vengeance on him, so he sent a trusted friend to the rendezvous last night. Whether the friend had the money he would not say. But after waiting for an hour or more he saw no one, and reported back that there was "nothing doing."

NO FRAUD IN CHINA CASE.

KILLED IN NEW BUILDING.

Wheelbarrow of Concrete Drops 20 Stories on Two Laborers.

An unidentified Italian laborer and another who is known only as "No. 135" were crushed to death to-day at the foot of the temporary elevator shaft in the new Forty-second Street Building at Forty-second street and Madison avenue by a wheelbarrow loaded with concrete which plunged down the shaft from the twentieth story.

Forty laborers, employed by Walter A. Meyers, who has the contract for the concrete work, were just putting the finishing touches on the job, which was to have been completed this afternoon. The two men who were killed were in the cellar looking the filled wheelbarrow on the lifts. The thirty-two survivors, unhurt by the accident, quit work.
