

HOME RULE BILL NOT NEEDED HERE, GAYNOR ASSERTS

Product of Law-Tinkers and Used to Cover Deal of Humburg.

Mayor Gaynor today declared he is opposed to the home rule bill pending in Albany and expressed the hope that Gov. Sulzer will not approve the measure. "No, I am not in favor of the so-called Home Rule bill," said the Mayor. "The phrase 'home rule' is being used nowadays to cover up a good deal of humbug. I refused to join with other Mayors in recommending this so-called home rule bill. It is not necessary in any city, in my judgment, and I know it is not necessary to this city."

"The Corporation Counsel advises me that it makes the consent of the Board of Aldermen necessary to granting all franchises hereafter. We look that power away from the Board of Aldermen only a few years ago for cause. Some persons are never happy unless they are tinkering with the laws. With good and competent men you will have good government under poor laws, and without such men you cannot have good government under the best of laws. As soon as something happens there are some persons who think that what is needed is a new law. "There are some whose fingers itch to be at this law-tinkering all the time. They are, as a rule, persons who do nothing for good government under the laws which we have. I hope the Governor will not approve this bill. But, of course, he is the best Judge of the matter and a man of prudence."

DOUGHERTY TELLS HOW HAPPY JACK CONFESSED TO KILLING OF M'BREEN

Man Fighting for His Life Wanted to Save Pal Who Had a Family.

More testimony adduced before Judge Rosaley in the Court of General Sessions today in the prosecution of "Happy Jack" Mulroney, now in the death house at Sing Sing awaiting execution for the murder of Patrick McBrean, for a new trial, showed that Mulroney was, at the time of the murder, a morphine fiend. Charles P. Hart, an apothecary in the Tombs, testified that when Mulroney was brought to the Tombs in December, 1911, he was suffering from the use of morphine. In order to relieve his suffering the drug, to the extent of a grain a day, had to be given to him. "I stated, in response to a question by Judge Rosaley, that 25 out of 750 prisoners confined in the Tombs were habitual drug users. Judge Rosaley called Deputy Police Commissioner George E. Dougherty as a witness. Commissioner Dougherty

said he had read the confession to both Mulroney and Dowling and had warned them as to their legal rights. "Mulroney said," Commissioner Dougherty testified, "that he would take the responsibility for the murder, and that Dowling was not but 'a poor slob' and had four children to look after. Mulroney told me that if Dowling had worked the job right the shooting of McBrean would not have been necessary, but when Dowling went behind the counter to tap the cash register he was a little bit slow, and when Mulroney tackled him he (Mulroney) had to shoot McBrean. When Mulroney signed the confession he was somewhat hysterical. You see, Mulroney was an abnormal man—a sort of a don't-give-a-care fellow. He did not impress me as though he was under the influence of any drug."

Cross-examined by Mr. Shay, Commissioner Dougherty said that 50 per cent of the crooks of New York City were either cocaine or morphine fiends. In some instances, he said, habitual users of these drugs could not be detected as users of the drug.

SEIZED "DOPE" WAS CRYSTALLIZED SUGAR.

Put Up in Drug Bottles and Stamped as Cocaine to Fool Users of It.

SAN FRANCISCO, April 9.—Eight hundred pounds of white crystals—four trunksful—seized last night in a hotel here and supposed to be cocaine, proved under analysis yesterday to be crystallized sugar candy.

All the sugar was put up in drug bottles bearing the name of a Montreal manufacturing chemist, and labeled "cocaine hydrochloride, large crystals, highest quality."

The owner evidently planned to impose on the cravings of drug users. Edward Arlington, who is under arrest, admits having stored the trunks where they were found but denies he is the owner.


