

VALUE OF EXEMPT PROPERTY IN CITY IS \$1,796,620,453

Central Park Alone Is Worth \$380,000,000 to Father Knickerbocker.

UNCLE SAM BIG OWNER.

Post-Office Is Worth \$11,000,000; Brooklyn Bridge, \$10,500,000.

The annual detailed list of properties in the city of New York exempt from taxation has been received by City Clerk P. J. Scully from C. Rockland Tyns, secretary to the Department of Taxes and Assessments. Its totals show that exemptions in Manhattan in assessed valuation amount to the enormous total of \$1,294,620,453, while in Brooklyn the total is \$257,710,401. In the Bronx exempt properties are valued at \$147,078,725. In Queens they are valued at \$49,770,876, and in Richmond at \$17,432,425. The grand total for all boroughs is \$1,796,620,453. Of this last figure approximately \$1,200,000,000 represents the value of land and real estate improvements owned by the city of New York itself, that amount being in excess of the total assessed valuation of properties for taxation in the city of Boston.

Uncle Sam possesses a valuable exempt holding in Governor's Island, which is valued, with improvements, at \$2,000,000, and another bit of exempt property is the post-office and site, valued at \$1,000,000. But Uncle Sam, by comparison with Father Knickerbocker, is a piker in local holdings, even when such big parcels as Central Park, Bronx Park and other large recreation reservations are excluded from consideration, for City Hall Park, with its buildings, is valued at \$7,500,000, the new Municipal Building at \$11,600,000, the Hall of Records at \$7,000,000, the Criminal Courts Building at \$2,000,000, the City Prison at \$1,900,000 and Bowling Green Park at \$1,700,000.

BROOKLYN BRIDGE IN MANHATTAN IS WORTH \$6,000,000.

In connection with Bowling Green may be enumerated some holdings of Uncle Sam which have not been mentioned above. There is the Customs

House, valued at \$3,000,000; the Army Office, valued at \$2,500,000; the Treasury, valued at \$2,500,000. Father Knickerbocker affects these holdings at one clip with Battery Park and the Aquarium, valued at \$5,625,000. Trinity Church's Cemetery, at the head of Wall street, is valued at \$17,500,000 and the church thereon at \$200,000, while Trinity Chapel and School, on the same grounds, with its site, is valued at \$250,000. Many piers along the downtown water front are valued from \$100,000 to \$1,450,000 each. St. Peter's R. C. Church, at Barclay and Church streets, is valued, with the site and its parochial school, at \$10,000. St. Paul's Cemetery and church site are valued at \$3,900,000, and the church building thereon at \$50,000, the school and office and site connected with St. Paul's activities being valued at \$25,000.

Fulton Market is valued at \$25,000, the Brooklyn Bridge at \$5,000,000, Columbus Park at \$1,485,000, Washington Market at \$1,025,000, Corlears Hook Park at \$500,000, the Newboys' Lodging House, Nos. 7 to 11 Duane street, at \$210,000, the Manhattan Hedge (in Manhattan) at \$1,200,000, the Williamsburg Bridge (in Manhattan) at \$3,000,000, the Norfolk street public school and site, at \$1,100,000, Police Headquarters at \$1,000,000, Washington Square Park at \$2,000,000, the United States Appraiser's Store on Broadway street, at \$1,600,000, St. Vincent's Hospital at \$700,000, Jefferson Market Court at \$500,000, West Washington Market at \$1,100,000, the General Theological Seminary on Ninth avenue, at \$1,525,000; the New York institution for the Blind on Ninth avenue, from Thirty-third to Thirty-fifth streets, at \$1,150,000; the new Post Office on Ninth avenue, from Thirty-first to Thirty-third street, at \$4,100,000; the Ninth Regiment Armory at \$35,000,000; St. Francis Xavier Church and College at \$1,500,000; the New York Hospital at

The property of the storage and moving concern was not affected, nor its business impaired.

ARREST FOR ANOTHER CRIME LEADS TO BIGAMY CHARGE.

Incriminating Letter Found When Portman Was Accused of Passing Worthless Check.

Isaac Portman, alias Abraham Greenberg, of No. 47 East Ninth street, Flatbush, was placed on trial before Judge Pike in the Brooklyn County Court today on the charge of bigamy. His bigamous marriage is alleged to have been contracted with Bertha Levine in 1908, at a time when an interlocutory decree of divorce had been granted his first wife, Rachel Greenberg, but never made final.

Portman's arrest on the bigamy charge followed, accidentally, the finding of a copy of a divorce decree in his pocket when he was arrested last Christmas on the charge of passing a worthless check.

The crew of the Adamastor was saved and transferred to a Portuguese gunboat, which with other vessels hurried to the assistance of the distressed cruiser. The Adamastor was built in 1886 at Leghorn. She is 342 feet long and of 1,120 tons.
