

BROOKLYN RECEIVES NEARLY AS MUCH CASH AS ALL THE BOROUGHS

Comptroller Shows That His Home Section Is Not Slighted.

That Brooklyn is receiving for the year 1913 nearly as much money in appropriations as all the other boroughs put together was the somewhat pointed statement made to-day by Comptroller Frederick in answer to criticisms from his home town to the effect that Brooklyn had been slighted. The charge followed the rejection by the Board of Estimate yesterday of \$2,000,000 of the \$2,200,000 reported by the corporate stock market committee.

Of the \$2,000,000 allowed only \$2,000,000 was awarded Brooklyn, the amount going to Borough President Steer's office. The Comptroller points out items totaling \$2,000,000: incorporate stock allowance made for Brooklyn during the year. There is also pending before the Board of Estimate the plans for the marginal railroad in South Brooklyn which when completed will represent a total of at least \$1,200,000. The immediate authorizations for this railroad would represent \$2,000,000. This makes a grand total of \$2,200,000.

All the other appropriations for all the other boroughs during the year, including the long docks in Manhattan and the site for the new Court House in Manhattan, will not be more than \$2,000,000. It will therefore be seen that Brooklyn is getting within \$2,000,000 as much as all the rest of the city. The Comptroller said he could not see any one could charge that the borough of Brooklyn is being discriminated against.

WOMAN IN TWO RIBS OF WIFE.

Williamburg Stone Mason Now Locked Up for Poisonous Assault.

While Mrs. Sadie Nolan was preparing breakfast in her flat at No. 265 7th avenue, Williamburg, to-day, her husband, Frank, a stonemason suddenly attacked her with a club. The woman screamed for help. Policemen came to the Bedford avenue station and into the house and overpowered Nolan after a fight.

Mrs. Nolan was taken to Williamburg Hospital suffering from scalp wounds and two fractures of the ribs of the right side. She said her husband had been acting irrationally for several days and had attacked her without warning. Nolan was locked up, charged with felonious assault.

ARMOUR CRITICISES. MEDDLING GOVERNMENT

Meat Packer Places Blame on Administration for Bad Business.

J. Ogden Armour, meat packer, returning from a tour of Europe, made strictures to-day on Government interference. He was a passenger on the Mauritania, and said that the country would be all right if there were not so much interference by the Government in railroad affairs.

"I speak as a shipper when I say that rates should be raised," said the packer, "and I believe that it would be best for

all interests in the country. I believe that I voice the sentiment of all business men in both my utterances. If the Government would have less to do with the railroads and if rates were permitted to be raised we would see an immediate improvement to the profit of the whole country in general." John H. McFadden, a cotton man of Philadelphia, returned on the Mauritania, after a short stay abroad. He said that while it was too early to make predictions, he saw no reason why the cotton crop this year should not be a bumper crop.

FIRE SCARE AT NAVARRE.
