

### KENNEDY'S OLD PLACE TO BE RELIEVED OF POLICE ESPIONAGE

Waldo Restrained From Posting Men in Front of Once Famous Gambling Resort.

The temporary injunction against the police which was granted yesterday by Justice Giefferich upon application of Charles L. Hoffman, counsel for the Traders and Importers' Club, Inc., restrains Commissioner Waldo and his subordinates from posting policemen in front of what used to be one of the most famous gambling resorts in the city—Kennedy's place at No. 25 West Thirty-second street. For four days following an inspection made of the present Traders and Importers' Club rooms by Inspector Gillen policemen had been stationed before the doors of the old four-story brownstone building to warn all incomers that they were entering a gambling house.

When Kennedy gave the place up about two years ago, following persistent raids, no change was made in the elaborate defensive details of the building and it stands to-day a veritable fortress just off Fifth avenue. The heavy oak door is sheathed inside with an inch plate of steel, all the windows across the windows on the first and basement floors are of steel, and the locks of all doors are operated by a single electric switch. They can be thrown on simultaneously by the pressure of a thumb.

The interior of the clubhouse is richly furnished, as in the former days of magnificence, heavy tapestries and rich paintings grace the walls. A blackboard just inside the front door has the following names of the House Committee upon it: G. Haskell, J. Adler and M. Marx.

Since the injunction granted yesterday had not been served on Commissioner Waldo, to-day the policemen still guard the portals of the club.

### ARTIST ARTHUR DAWSON AND THE CLAUSEN CASE.

Witness Points Out Error in Report of His Testimony in Picture Suit.

The Evening World of Jan. 10 last published an article in which it was erroneously stated that Arthur Dawson, the artist, had testified on the witness stand that he did "Near Newport" and "Old Mill Near St. Cloud," and labeled them as painted by Homer Martin. As a matter of fact Mr. Dawson did not so testify.

Mr. Dawson was a witness in March, 1910, in an action brought in the Supreme Court by William T. Evans, art collector, against William Clausen, art dealer, to recover the price paid for the paintings above named, which purported to be by Homer Martin, but which Mr. Evans alleged were not genuine. Mr. Dawson testified that prior to the sale of the pictures to Mr. Evans they had been turned over to him by Mr. Clausen, and he illustrated on the witness stand how he had removed the old canvas from the back of one of the paintings and supplied a new backing for it. He denied that he had himself painted either of the pictures other than to "retore" them, adding that he had no reason to "oubt their genuineness as the work of Homer Martin. Noted artists testified on both sides and the trial resulted in a disagreement, the jury standing eleven to one for the defendant, as claimed by him. The case has been set for retrial in November.

### REBEL FLAG AT GETTYSBURG

Southern Soldiers May Bring Them to the Reunion.

GETTYSBURG, Pa., June 27.—That the Stars and Bars as well as the Stars and Stripes will appear at the big camp of veterans during the anniversary celebration was indicated to-day by an announcement from the officers of the anniversary commission that "there is nothing to prevent the wearers of the gray from bringing along their battle flags."

At the same time it was said that the flag of the Confederacy would not be used in any official decorations over which the commission has control.

Residents of Gettysburg and Union veterans already here are extending a royal welcome to all arriving Confederate veterans.

The town itself never has been so gayly decorated. Every business block is covered with the national colors, and practically every home displays at least one flag. The Stars and Bars appear at a number of places, while the use of both the blue and the gray is a favorite method of decoration at many buildings.

Finishing touches were put on the camp to-day. Equipment was distributed to the 5,000 tents, all of which are now up, and everything is in readiness for the 10,000 old soldiers expected to attend the celebration next week.

### GIVES UP LITERARY WORK.

Page Will Devote All His Time in Italy to Diplomacy.

WASHINGTON, June 27.—Thomas Nelson Page, the new Ambassador to Italy, will drop his literary work while abroad in the service of the United States and devote all his talents to the art of diplomacy.
