

Making Dresses at Home From Original Designs

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DESCRIPTION.

No matter what the fashion of the moment may be, the simple dress design I am showing will always hold its own. It is a style which, though possessing a standard cut, has no extreme points of fashion to characterize it. The simple opening is universally becoming in outline with a band of contrasting fabric continuing down the side opening of the skirt to below the hip line.

This trimming also forms a strap on the back of the elbow sleeve and trims the two patch pockets. Much depends upon the quality and design of the embroidery, being it is the only trimming on a simple front, and is therefore particularly noticeable.

For morning wear green linen would give this model admirably, with white lace trimming bands hand embroidered in green and black, while a plain patent leather belt would be chosen at the waist line. Any other plain colored linen evolved in the same way would also be pretty.

Of course white linen for the dress could be trimmed with either white or pink colored bands and embroidered in white when either a colored sash belt or black could be worn. The effect would be distinctive. For materials, white lace would be a practical color, with brown embroidery on self color. The waist and skirt bands, by the way, are laid under the task facing of the waist and skirt, and are supported by one and the same stitching. The little front yoke may be of the dress material, or sheer tulle or lace might suggest that for a practical summer silk dress this design is convenient and permits of the same occasion as I have mentioned for the linen, or any of the hand work on bands of the material would be demurely rich looking and serviceable.

ANSWERS TO QUERIES.

Dear Helen Miller:
Will you kindly suggest a suitable waist and material for a dress for my daughter, something for beach wear and afternoon. She is fourteen years of age, tall and thin, light-brown wavy hair and brown eyes, very little coloring. Would prefer white. Would also like a similar suggestion for her sister, aged seventeen years, with brown hair and eyes, but short, best 28 inches, color 19 inches and tall. MRS. L. C.
For your younger daughter use white cotton opening, the waist cut in simple style, and having a short yoke back and front, so as to which the blouse part is slightly gathered. Finish the yoke and opening with a cord, while a round collar of bolero, hand embroidered, with cord to match, would be effective. Have a tie yoke on the skirt, finished with a cording so as to which the lower portion may be gathered slightly. A cord at the lower would relieve the plainness, while a belt of red patent leather

a straight vest portion made from embroidered banding, also broad collar and cuffs of same, would complete the effect. A plain skirt opened on each side seam should be used, and a belt of green or black made would be pretty.
