SOME OF THOSE WHO WILL BE NEEDED IN THE FALL. The Giants' record of twenty-three hits exceeds all marks made in the National League for this season by several points and is one of the most copious exhibitions of baseball mauling that has ever been seen since the game began turning out heroic stunts.

EVERS EJECTED FOR HUMANITARIAN REASONS. Lord Byron, the humanitarian umpire, fixed it so that Johnny Evers couldn't see the slaughter. Just before the rough work started Evers complained of a decision at second base and made such pointed references to Byron's personality that he was summarily ejected from the field.
