

BLACK HAND SUSPECT HELD FOR CARRYING WEAPON

Detectives Watch Appointed Rendezvous for Two Months to Catch Man.

Wright, for two months, Detectives German and De Martini of East Fifty-first street station have kept vigil under the First avenue arch of the Queensboro Bridge for it was there that a Black Hand letter warned Joseph Gibbia, a well-to-do leather merchant of No. 224 East Eighty-ninth street, to leave \$500 in a package on penalty of his life. A short man in a light overcoat was to come for the package, said the letter which Gibbia turned over to the police, and German and De Martini arranged a package and took their stand in the shadow of the arch.

At midnight last night they saw a short man in a light overcoat come to the arch, look around, and apparently, failing to see the decoy package, walk slowly away. German was so sure he had the right man that he followed him, and at Sixty-second street arrested him. In his pocket the detective found a razor.

Magistrate Corrigan in the Yorkville Court offered the fellow a chance to explain this morning, but beyond saying that he was Pasquale Martino and wishing to tell his address the man would say nothing. Magistrate Corrigan held him in \$500 bail for trial to Special Sessions on a charge of carrying concealed weapons.
