

**MITCHEL ANSWERS  
ATTACK BY M'CALL  
ON CATSKILL PURCHASE**

**Denies He Was on Committee  
That Arranged Deal for  
\$1,000,000.**

Collector John Purroy Mitchell, when asked to-day regarding Judge McCall's statement last night that Mitchell had been an instrument in the city's purchase of the right of way of a small railroad in the Catskills for \$1,000,000, when it could have been bought for \$400,000, said:

"As far as I can recollect, I was not a member of any committee having this matter in charge. Mr. McCall's statement is as gross a misrepresentation as I would have expected from him."

Judge McCall's reference to the Ulster and Delaware Railroad, in the Aqueduct region, came after a statement made by Collector Mitchell last night, in which he ridiculed the idea of economy from a Tammany candidate for office. McCall asserted that Collector Mitchell knew very well just what sort of extravagance in the administration of city affairs he proposed to go after.

"Tell him," said the Judge, "that I would not sanction the city's buying a watershed railroad's right of way for \$1,000,000 when it could have been acquired for \$400,000."

McCall further stated that "the guiding mind in that transaction was John Purroy Mitchell," and, further, that it was on Mr. Mitchell's report that the purchase was confirmed.

As bearing on the controversy as tending to show that Mayor Gaynor was the active force in the purchase of the railroad, the friends of Collector Mitchell produced a letter written by Gaynor to Charles Strause, President of the Board of Water Supply, on May 12, 1911. The letter read in part:

"When the negotiations were opened in my office by you and Mr. Cockenald, president of the road and his counsel, Judge Clearwater, not three months ago, it did not seem to me possible that the matter could be brought to a head so speedily, but your daily persistence in the matter soon brought it to a head and to a complete settlement."

President Mitchell was a member of the Board of Estimate when the present Fusion list of Estimates authorized the purchase of the railroad.
