

JOY AND SORROW WHEN VOLTURNO'S SURVIVORS MEET

Some Families Are Reunited,
but Others Find Their
Ranks Broken.

At the Clara de Hirsch Home, the Nurses' Home, the Seamen's Home and the Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society there were scenes of joy and of sadness this morning as husbands met wives whom they had believed lost on the Uranium liner Volturmo and as parents were reunited with children, or as happened only too often frantic mothers sought in vain for little ones and wives hated husbands without success.

The survivors brought in by the Kronland and some of those rescued by the Seydlitz who made their way here from Philadelphia were distributed among the homes here. Thirteen were sent to the Clara de Hirsch Home in Second Avenue, three children to the Nurses' Home at No. 25 Henry Street, fourteen to the Seamen's Home in Water Street and fifty-nine to the Hebrew Aid Society at No. 229 East Broadway.

They made a pathetic sight. They were clothed in all manner of nondescript garments. Some of the children wore bathrobes which had been cut in two sections resembling a rough suit of pajamas, but all were thankful to be alive, and those who found relatives awaiting them declared it was the happiest day of their lives.

MOTHER AND THREE CHILDREN GO TO HOSPITAL.

A little group of five, two women and three children, were sent to St. Vincent's Hospital. They were Mrs. Anna de Groot and Mrs. Anna Groenvelt and the latter's children, Florette, four years old, Jettie, one and a half, and John, six months old. They came from Norway and were on their way to Michigan. Little John is seriously ill, threatened with pneumonia, and when it was found necessary to take him to the hospital the authorities let the rest of the party go with him.

Little Stanis Borden, a year and a half old, was found to have measles and the little girl, with her mother, Mrs. Hannah Borden, and her three-year-old brother, Stefan, was taken to the hospital on Ellis Island.

Fourteen-year-old Milka Pollack and her sisters, Goldie, None and Hannah, seven, with their cousin, Chajin Kushner, sixteen years old, all from Russia, were weeping at the Hebrew Aid Society last night when an excited man burst through the police lines which had been formed about the place and grabbed up little Hannah.

"My children, my children!" he cried. "Where is mamma?"

He was Gershen Pollack of No. 543 East One Hundred and Thirty-ninth Street, the Bronx, and though the children couldn't tell him the officials of the home learned that his wife, Leah, was safe aboard the Rappahannock.

WIFE FINUS HUSBAND SHE MOURNED.

There was a joyful reunion early this morning when Maria Busiautz reached the Hebrew Aid Society from the Seydlitz at Philadelphia. The woman was in tears, mourning for her husband Valentine, when Supt. Samuel Mason told her her husband was safe in the home. Valentine was aroused at once and for the rest of the night the reunited couple sat holding tight to each other's hands and telling of their experiences since they parted on the deck of the Volturmo.

Seven-year-old Blume Weisberg, a beautiful blond-haired child, declared she knew her mother was saved, but she was frantic over the loss of her father, Wolff, and her small brother, Isaac. Her mother is in Philadelphia, having come in on the Seydlitz, but no word has been received of the husband or brother.

Eleven-year-old Chia Schutt was perfectly happy taking care of her sixteen-year-old brother Josef. They are on their way to their father, Aaron, in Philadelphia, and were travelling alone. The little girl proved herself the manager of the party.

"Josef wanted to jump overboard," she said, "but I wouldn't let him. I told him God would take care of us and He did."

Mrs. Angele Tourneur, who was on her way from Calais to her husband in Canada, was heartbroken over the loss of her little daughter, Angele, three years old. The mother and her ten-month-old son, Victor, were saved. Henri Bouqueneau, a friend, had strapped little Angele to his back and jumped overboard with her. He came up under a lifeboat and the child was swept from his back. He was saved.
