Warmer weather is predicted and full spinning returns expected next Saturday, according to arguments.

Cotton receipts at the ports are estimated at 60,000 bales, against 68,000 bales same date last year.

In the first hour cotton prices advanced further from 4 to 8 points. Foreign spinners are said to be alarmed over reported further curtailment of crop and damage reports are more numerous than yesterday.

Cotton advanced slowly to new high

figures. December advanced to 14 cents, up 22 points from yesterday's close. Basing was caused by storm reports from Texas.

In the late afternoon, cotton, after a still further advance, reacted from the best figures, from 11 to 12 points, and closed showing net advances ranging from 10 to 24 points over yesterday's close.
