\$25,000 BLAZE TESTS HORSES AND MEN IN DOWNTOWN SECTION

Fire that tested men and gave department horses an opportunity to live up to old traditions did more than \$25,000 damage at No. 29 Cliff street this morning.

When James Cannan, private watchman, discovered the blaze and turned in an alarm the third floor of a five-story building was burning hotly.

Deputy Chief Binns issued his first order to the drivers when he looked over the sweating, panting animals.

"Take them to Engine Company No. 1, rub them down, blanket them and give them hay," he said.

He then hastened to surround the dangerous outburst of flame which had leaped to the roof and was making a huge glare, visible for miles along the river.

The fire made for the building at No. 15 Cliff street, occupied by Hancock Bros. & White, manufacturing chemists, and Binns directed a number of heavy streams into the upper floors of the structure, saving it, but causing extensive damage from water.

The snow was directly responsible for a fire in a shed back of St. Joseph's Roman Catholic Church in Cedarhurst early to-day.

Sexton Herman Johnson discovered the blaze caused by snow and water leaking into some barrels of lime.

The sexton ran to pull the bell rope to summon help but found that snow had frozen in a pipe through which the rope passed, so the bell could not be rung.

The engine and hose company responded to the belated alarm but the engine stalled in a snow bank and it was necessary to unhitch three horses from the hose wagon to rescue the engine.
