

N. Y. ATHLETIC CLUB TO SUSPEND MEMBERS CAUGHT GIVING TIPS

"Society of Itching Palm" Banished From Portals of the Clubhouse.

The "Society of the Itching Palm" is doomed in the New York Athletic Club. Givers and receivers of tips in the clubhouse of that organization are to be severely punished by the House Committee.

Letters were sent to-day to each member of the club calling attention to House Rule No. 9, which forbids the giving of gratuities and warning offenders that they will be dealt with to the fullest extent of the club's laws.

President William H. Page Jr. and George W. Montgomery, Vice-President and Chairman of the House Committee, are determined that the tipping evil shall be banished. Servants detected accepting gratuities will be discharged immediately and members reported to have offered or given tips will be hailed before the House Committee. If proven guilty they will be suspended, and if the offense is repeated they will probably be dropped from membership.

The officers said to-day that the rule in regard to tipping has been in force many years, but it is apparent it has not been obeyed. Those who have been disregarding the rule and giving tips have, of course, received better service from the employees.

5,000 NON-UNION GIRLS GET ORDER TO STRIKE

Workers on Children's Dresses Demand Fifty-Hour Week and Wage Increase.

Red paper circulars printed in Yiddish, Italian and English will be distributed to-day among the 5,000 girls employed in the non-union shops where children's dresses are made. These circulars will call on the girls to quit work and to go to the meeting halls in accordance with a decision yesterday to go on strike. The strike was decided on a week ago by the executive committee of the Children's Dressmakers Union and yesterday representatives of the girls in the various shops unanimously approved it. The demands are for a fifty-hour working week, a 15 per cent. increase in wages, union shop conditions and a price committee in the shops to arrange for the wages of the piece workers.
