**FIVE 'LIFERS,' UNGUARDED,

Two Convict Nurses Also When Sing Sing Principal Keeper's Services Are Held.

OSWING, N. Y., March 27.—Among those who filed past the casket in which lay the body of James Cunningham, the "P. K." or principal keeper, for two score years of Sing Sing prison, to-day were five life term prisoners from Sing Sing who went from the prison to the house and back again unescorted. Two convict nurses who attended the "P. K." during his illness were also unguarded at the church ceremony in St. Augustine's. The prison was under holiday status

to-day. After the convicts had breakfast they were sent back to their cells, and the keepers and instructors from the shops were then at liberty until after the mass over the remains. There was a large attendance at the funeral. The body will be interred at Albany.
