

**REFUSAL OF DAY OFF  
FOR BOAT HANDS TIES  
UP 3. & O. SHIPPING**

**Towboats and Lighters Idle  
When Employees Walk  
Out—150 Involved.**

The marine department of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company is completely out of commission because of strikes. The company's eight towboats and three lighters were tied up this morning after the deckhands, firemen, oilers and cooks walked out because their demand for one day off a week was not complied with.

The strike was called by the Harbor Boatmen's Union of which the men of the Baltimore and Ohio are members. About 150 men are involved. The captains and pilots of the tug are not members of the union, but they are out with the rest because there are no men to man the boats. It is said that the strike may extend to the towboats of other railroad companies doing business in the harbor.

The New York Central, according to the union officials, grants to each of its towboat hands a day off in the week, and the Pennsylvania a day off every other week. The Baltimore and Ohio, Lehigh, Lackawanna, Erie and Jersey Central give no day off.

The last five roads work together in their marine departments under the name of the Allied Roads' Associated

Marine Department, and what affects one affects all.

Assistant Terminal Agent Salisbury wanted the boys to go to work this morning," said an officer of the Harbor Boatmen's Union, "but they had orders from the union not to do so. Mr. Salisbury said that he wanted to take the matter up with the B. & O. officials, but since our petition has been in his hands for more than a month we could not see any reason for further delay."

At the office of the Allied Roads' Associated Marine Department it was said that the matter of the strike had not been called to the association's attention, and that it was entirely up to the Baltimore and Ohio.

Assistant Terminal Agent Salisbury said:

"There was a conference at my office last night between myself and the representatives of the marine workers. The petitioners were in-

formed that because of present railroad business conditions it was extremely doubtful whether any changes would be made in working conditions at present, but that the matter would be laid before higher officials of the company to-day. It is apparent that a decision was reached to strike without awaiting the answer.

Arrangements are being made to handle our business and everything will be going normally to-night. We are now delivering and receiving freight at all terminals."
