

**OUT OF WORK, LEAPS OFF MANHATTAN BRIDGE; BODY NOT RECOVERED**

Man Ses Fatal Jump, but Is Too Far Away to Prevent It.

The Harbor Squad police are searching to-day for the body of a man believed to be B. L. Siegel, who jumped from the Manhattan Bridge shortly before midnight.

John McCarthy of No. 146 West Seventeenth street, Manhattan, told Policeman Lawlor of the Bridge Squad that as he was on his way to Brooklyn he saw a man jump into the East River from the middle span.

He was not near enough to get a good description, but said the man appeared to be about thirty years old and wore a gray overcoat. The policeman and McCarthy went to the spot from which the man jumped and found a roll of cheese cloth. Inside was a note reading:

**FOLLOW THESE 'DON'TS' AND YOU'LL AVOID MEAT POISONING.**

Summer ptomaine, or meat poisoning, the most common in warm weather, may be avoided, according to a bulletin just issued by the Health Department, if care and caution are observed. One of the first rules is: "Take proper care of the refrigerator and the refrigerator will take proper care of the meat."

- The following "Don'ts" are given for every housewife:
- Don't keep meat in refrigerator unless properly iced.
  - Don't omit to clean refrigerator frequently, using strong hot soda solution.
  - Don't use meat unless fresh; never attempt to freshen by washing with salt, soda, &c.
  - Don't buy chopped meats or sausage unless sure it is fresh.
  - Don't buy from butcher unless sure his meats are fresh and handled in sanitary manner.
  - Don't use canned foodstuffs unless absolutely sure the contents are good.



Last night he said he wanted no dinner and left the house about 7 o'clock.

He was about twenty-six years old, they said, smooth shaven, had dark brown hair and three upper front teeth filled with gold. He wore a gray overcoat such as the one worn by the man who leaped off the bridge. They knew of no trouble he had other than being out of work, and so far as they knew he had no relatives in New York.
