GAVE UP HIS \$900 FOR PLAIN PAPER TO PAIR OF SWINDLERS

Benjamin Schonbein Tells Judge His Story and One of Them Goes to Prison.

Benjamin Schonbein, a candy store keeper of No. 1672 Lexington avenue, told Judge Swann in General Sessions to-day how he lost \$900 in striving to get something for nothing.

"I met Kutler last June," Schonbein told Judge Swann. "He used to be janitor of a public school near my store. He told me of a wonderful man who could make bread grow on trees, pick dollar bills off the bushes in Central Park, and make men die by simply wishing it."

"I told him I had saved \$900 and he said he would show me how I could double it in one night. He and Kutler came to my house. I got out the money. He looked at the bills and copied the numbers of them. He then asked me for a wash basin, poured some liquid from a bottle into the basin and washed the bills in the mixture. Then he laid each wet bill between two pieces of paper. When he finished he placed two pieces of board on top of the package and sent me out of the room to get a piece of string. I was gone only a second or two. He tied up the package with the string and placed it in a closet piling flat irons on it to compress it. He told me not to disturb it until the next day, when he would return. He and Kutler then left. They did not return the next day, so I untied the package. It was nothing but worthless paper. The money had gone."

Kutler admitted his part in the transaction and said he and the stranger had divided Schonbein's money. Judge Swann sentenced Kutler to Sing Sing Prison for not less than two years nor more than four years.

ST. LOUIS PITCHER JUMPS TO FEDERALS, IGNORING CONTRACT

After Landing Hamilton, Stovall Tempts Other Browns With Valise of Money.

(Special to The Evening World.) ST. LOUIS, Mo., April 9.—(Earl Hamilton, the star southpaw of the

Browns, to-day jumped to the Kansas City Federal League club. Hamilton departed on a morning train for Kansas City in company with George Stovall, former St. Louis manager and now manager of the Kansas City club. Hamilton took the jump despite the fact that he has a three-year contract with the Browns, two years of which are unexpired. He said he leaped because Stovall offered more money than the Browns was willing to pay.

Stovall came here with C. C. Madison, President of the Kansas City club. They called in practically every member of the Browns into a conference and displayed a valise which contained \$50,000 in currency. Madison told the players that there was plenty more available. "You see," Stovall is also eager to land Pitchers Walter Levernz and George

Baumgardner. He is also said to be angling for Lee Moore, Harry Sallee and Ivy Wingo of the St. Louis Cardinals. When told that Hamilton had departed for Kansas City, President Hedges of the Browns said: "If there are players on our club who do not respect the contracts they hold or the word they gave the earlier we learn of them the better."

Hedges would not discuss the possibility of entering into legal action to prevent Hamilton from playing with the Kansas City Club.
