sprinter, rushed a well-dressed young man. Right behind him, also running as hard as he could, was another well-dressed young man. The first of the pair disappeared as soon as he set foot on the boat and the second began a noisy search for him.

### BECKER'S LAWYER SAYS WHITMAN IS NOT PLAYING FAIR

Asks Court to Stop District Attorney From Creating Prejudice Against Client.

Martin T. Manton, who succeeded Joseph A. Shay as counsel for ex-Lieut. Charles Becker, practically charged District-Attorney Whitman to-day with issuing for publication false statements concerning Becker for the purpose of creating an atmosphere to influence the 300 special taxmen who are to appear in the Criminal Branch of the Supreme Court on May 6.

Mr. Manton made his statement to Justice Seabury after he had concurred in Mr. Whitman's motion for the drawing of the special panel, saying:

"I desire to call your attention to stories published in to-day's newspapers intimating that the defendant, Becker, purchased perjured testimony. That and other features of the stories are absolutely false. One newspaper purports to quote the District-Attorney. 'The stories are being circulated to create atmosphere—that same atmosphere which the Court of Appeals in reversing Becker's conviction declared against. They are eminently unfair to this defendant, and I ask Your Honor to put a stop to them.'

Justice Seabury declined to act, however, unless Mr. Manton would supply him with affidavits showing that control of the matter fell within the proper jurisdiction of the court and the lawyer, citing the action of Justice Jaycox in Brooklyn in the Cassidy trial when he instituted an investigation of newspaper stories, declared:

"I have done my duty in calling this matter to your attention and I emphasize the need that action be taken. Outside the court Mr. Manton said that if Justice Seabury did not take up the matter he should apply to Gov. Glynn. He said that his side was ready for the trial, 'in better position than the District-Attorney and it will be his duty, who asks for delay.'

Some leading lawyers in this city will have a lot of explaining to do, completed his investigation into the 'perjury factory' revealed by William E. Burwell and Karl Dresner, the witnesses whom ex-Magistrate Charles G. F. White and H. Lionel Kringsel produced before Supreme Justice Justice Goff in an eleven-hour effort to save the four gunmen from the penalty for Herman Rosenthal's murder. He intimated that the Association would conduct an inquiry. It was the published story of Mr.

Whitman's early morning interview with Burwell, who was brought from New Haven, Conn., to which Mr. Manton objected. Mr. Whitman was quoted as saying that Burwell and Dresner, telling practically the same story had confessed that they had offered their testimony for sale and had been coached by men close to Becker in the stories they were to tell. Burwell, the District-Attorney said, complained that he had received only \$20 of the \$1,000 promised to him.

### "MET" GOLF TOURNAMENT DATE ADVANCED TO AUG. 5.

Players Complained Original Date Made It Too Close to National Championship.

Frederick H. Thomas, Secretary of the Metropolitan Golf Association, announced this afternoon that the dates for the playing of the Metropolitan Open Championship over the Scarsdale course had been switched from Aug. 12 and 13 to Aug. 5 and 6. The change in dates was made at the request of many "pro" golfers who claimed that the "Met" tournament was too near the National Championship at Midlothian, which starts Aug. 12. It was pointed out that players who competed in both meets would hardly have sufficient time to go from Scarsdale to Chicago and prepare for the national event.

Mayor Adopts Beautification. Mayor Mitchell spoke briefly to the members of the South Brooklyn Board of Trade at its annual dinner in the Imperial Restaurant in Fulton street last night on the marginal terminal railway plan, legislation for which was vetoed a few days ago by Gov. Glynn. The Mayor told the 300 men present that it would be necessary to rehabilitate public opinion, two Governors having nullified the legislation which he favored.



