The murderer, David Mitchell, a highly respected negro, is said to have found his wife living with another man at a boarding-house at No. 370 Academy street.


Following the shooting, Mitchell ran to High and Bank streets, where he took refuge in an arway. For an hour he held the police at bay with two automatic pistols.
