NOTED SWINDLER CAUGHT IN RAID ON OPIUM DEN

Lewis MacDowell, Who Once Posed as Morgan's Nephew, Admits Identity.

A diamond thief and swindler with a twenty-year police record in jails here and abroad was recognized by detectives this morning when the five prisoners rounded up in an opium raid on a flat at Forty-fourth street and Ninth avenue last night, were brought to police headquarters.

It took the oldest of the Headquarters men to recognize in the pale, drawn features of the prisoner the man who for twenty years posed on different occasions as J. P. Morgan's nephew, the son of Mark Hanna, William J. Piemp, the millionaire brewer, and got away with thousands of dollars.

Lewis C. MacDowell, the name accredited to the prisoner, in his day was the most polished of crooks, the

Beau Brummel of his profession, with a smoothness of manner and personality that enabled him to perpetrate his crimes in the highest circles. The police charge to him in this city alone the theft of more than \$70,000 of diamonds from Maiden Lane dealers. His record reaches across the country, and there are few jails in which he has not served his bit.

The identity was admitted promptly. "Didn't recognize me since I shaved off my mustache and got a little bald," remarked the prisoner. The detectives then looked up his record, filed under the number 4,887. The prisoner's greatest success as an impostor was about a decade ago. Hundreds were victimized in the swindles MacDowell put through posing as young Hanna, Morgan's nephew and other prominent persons. The police in this city finally "got" MacDowell on a larceny charge in November, 1903. He served three years in Sing Sing. He gave New York a live berth when he got out and went direct to London, where,

in 1904, he posed in English clubs as one of the Harvard crew who went to row the Oxford crew at Henley. He was arrested in London on several charges. The raid in which the five prisoners, one a woman, were trapped, resulted from an anonymous letter sent to Police Headquarters, complaining that sickly-looking men and women were seen nightly around the suspected apartment in West Forty-fourth street. Detective under Lieut. Scherb smelled opium in the hall of the apartment and broke down the door. Five were taken, including MacDowell and Abraham Goldberg, who is held as the proprietor.

SCHOOL DIRECTORS QUIT.

Men Opposed to Mayor Resign from Bayonne Board. Four members of the Bayonne Board of Education resigned last night. They and others have been in opposition to the policies of Mayor B. J. Daly. Those who resigned were Joseph N. McCormack, President of the board; John H. Heiser, Frederick Kuenzle and John J. Keller. Several days ago Michael J. O'Keefe, a Republican who voted

with the four named in opposition to the policies of Mayor Daly, resigned. With his vote the four who resigned last night could block the Mayor, but as the Mayor would have the appointment of Mr. O'Keefe's successor the other four decided to resign and let the Mayor name five members.
