

CONFESSED CRIMES HE DIDN'T COMMIT, BUT CAUGHT NOW

Police Expect to Show Man Who Said He Sent Bombs Is Plain Burglar.

John Farrell, the same man, according to the police, who gained notoriety last year by his confession, afterward proved false, that he had sent the bombs which killed Mrs. Bernard Herrers and Mrs. Heloid Taylor and thus brought on himself suspicion of having sent the bomb Judge Rosalsky received, was held in \$2,000 bail to-day by Magistrate Dooley in the Flatbush Police Court until Friday. Before then the police expect to connect him with several of the forty odd robberies which have terrified residents of Flatbush lately. Farrell was caught last night after a chase by young Lester Hare of No. 1733 Avenue Q, son of "Jimmy" Hare, the war photographer.

Young Hare was calling on the daughter of Police Capt. Michael J. Reidy of the Parkville station at the Reidy home, No. 731 East Twenty-first street, Flatbush, when he saw Farrell loitering about the house. When he saw Farrell go up the back steps he went after him. Hare broke his right arm cranking his automobile a few days ago and

were it in a sting last night. Nevertheless, he showed Farrell, who had led at his approach and made for the Long Island Railroad tracks, which run through a cut at Avenue H. Farrell got on the tracks, Hare following, and there, turning, presented a revolver at the young man's head. Hare whalloped him with his left hand and landed so effectively that Farrell went down senseless. Hare took the revolver away and when Farrell recovered drove him at the point of the pistol to the Parkville station.

According to the police Farrell had several trinkets, recognized as the property of William Jacobs of No. 742 East Twenty-first street, so a charge of grand larceny as well as violation of the Sullivan law was made against him. The police say that Farrell visited Police Headquarters in Brooklyn several days ago and offered to expose to Capt. Coughlin the man responsible for the numerous robberies in Flatbush. Then they thought him simple minded. Now they think he himself committed the burglaries. Farrell was janitor of the house at No. 1475 Fulton avenue, the Bronx, where Mrs. Herrers lived and was killed. It was only after Henry Klotz, draughtsman in the office of Borough President Miller of the Bronx, had lost his life in the premature explosion of a bomb he was making in his home, No. 1322 Fulton avenue, that Farrell was cleared of the charges to which he had confessed.
