

HUSSEY SUBPOENAS ALL THE POLICEMEN FROM TWO STATIONS

Captain Plans Fight to Keep Job—Trial Put Off Till To-Morrow.

Police Capt. James E. Hussey, who was convicted last year of conspiring with Capt. Murtha, Sweeney and Thompson to keep George A. Sipp, a graft witness, out of the State, and whose conviction alone out of the four was reversed by the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court, will be put on trial before Deputy Police Commissioner Godley to-morrow.

He was to have been tried to-day on charges of neglect of duty, violation of the rules and conduct unbecoming an officer, but Assistant Corporation Counsel Stover could not be present.

Hussey is going to make the fight of his life for his job. Francis A. Wellman, who is defending him, has subpoenaed every record and all the officers of the West One Hundred and Twenty-fifth and East One Hundred and Twenty-sixth street stations from July 30, 1909, to March 1, 1911, when Hussey was in charge of the district as Inspector.

The specific charges against Hussey which grew out of the Curran Aldermanic Police Inquiry, are that he asked for and accepted money from James Dougherty and Ashley Shea, in return permitting a disorderly resort and a gambling house to be operated without molestation.

Hussey held a sort of reception in the corridors of Police Headquarters to-day when his trial was adjourned. He seemed confident he would be exonerated.

Hussey was reinstated as a Captain by Commissioner Woods on Sept. 9 and suspended at once on the new charges. He held his badge only two minutes, but this was long enough to let him collect \$4,340 back pay.

WEALTHY WINE BROKER PLEADS WAR'S RAVAGES FOR LACK OF ALIMONY

Declares His Salary of \$20,000 Has Now Been Cut to \$1,500.

A considerable difference of opinion as to the financial standing of Le Roy M. Taylor, a broker in imported wines and other luxuries, and a member of the Larchmont Yacht, New York Athletic and other clubs, developed before Justice Jaycox in the Supreme Court in Brooklyn this afternoon.

On Taylor's behalf it was set forth that he was no longer able to pay \$4,800 a year alimony, granted to his first wife, Mrs. Marie J. Taylor, for the support of herself and their daughter Dorothy, when he was divorced in 1911. Mr. Taylor then had a drawing account of \$400 a week and commissions. According to his counsel the shutting off of imports by the war has reduced his income to \$1,500 a year, and he was recently obliged to sell his automobile to meet living expenses.

"Why, to hear this talk," said the divorced wife's lawyer, "you would think that Mr. Taylor was looking up the shortest road to the poor house. Our affidavits show he has a nice country home at Bayport, where he supports in luxury his present wife, he has a retinue of servants, from Japanese butler to chauffeur. He did sell an automobile—but he bought a fine new car in his wife's name. He has recently bought a \$40,000 yacht. He is merely trying to make an excuse for spending more money for the comfort and pleasure of the second wife at the expense of the first!"

Justice Jaycox took the papers under advisement.
