

**HUSBAND MISSING  
WITH \$1,100; WIFE  
FEARS HE'S MURDERED**

Coney Island Police Seeking  
Traces of Oscar Gally—  
Bathroom Clues.

Though the police were aiding the family of Oscar Gally, a stationer at No. 805 West One Hundred and Twenty-fifth street, to search for some trace of him at Coney Island and in Manhattan to-day, they do not entertain the family's belief that he has been murdered for the \$1,000 or more which he was in the habit of carrying strapped about the calf of his right leg.

Gally left home Wednesday a week ago to buy a complete outfit of new clothing for himself and his son, in accordance with the custom of orthodox Jews at the beginning of their new year. He did not return, and a week ago to-day the police, who had been asked by the family to look for him, sent word to his brother-in-law, Robert Lehman of No. 276 West One Hundred and Fourteenth street, that an envelope containing a watch and \$1.14 and marked with Gally's name and address had been left unclaimed at Stauch's baths, Coney Island. The bathroom to which Gally had been assigned revealed nothing. But yesterday the police again reported that a satchel with which Gally had left home had been found in another part of Stauch's pavilion, filled with his discarded clothing.

Mrs. Gally had withdrawn \$600 from her savings bank recently because of the war scare and put it in her husband's charge. He had drawn \$600, all he had, from his own bank. Lehman said that it would have been like his brother-in-law to check a small amount and hide the rest in the toe

of his shoes before going into the water. Gally told the members of his family before leaving home that he meant to meet a tobacco salesman with whom he had recently struck up an acquaintance and who would be able to get him a discount in the purchase of a sweater. Then, he said, they might go to Coney Island. The family does not know who the salesman was and fears Gally may have been lured away and murdered for his money.

**POLICEMAN SAVES WOMAN.**

Salesman's Wife Sends Children Out, Then Takes Gas.

As he was going down through the apartment house at No. 1746 Bathgate avenue Policeman Cullen, who had been called to chase some noisy boys from the roof, traced a smell of gas to the door of the apartment of Jacob Rosen-

He and the janitor broke down the door when there was no answer to his knock. They found Mrs. Sarah Marshall, wife of a travelling salesman, unconscious on a bed, with a tube from an open gas jet in her mouth. Dr. Frick, from Fordham Hospital, saved her life by a pulmonary.

Mrs. Marshall's husband had been out of work until this week and she had no money. She asked Mrs. Rosenberg, with whom she and her three children boarded, to take them out to walk. Then she tried to kill herself.

Littleton, Committee Chairman,  
Reports Deficit of \$7,320—  
Receipts Were \$7,104.

"I was never a successful beggar and I don't suppose I ever will be," writes Littleton to Mayor Mitchell, who appointed him Chairman of the last Independence Day Celebration Committee.

There is a deficit of \$7,320 in the accounts of the committee, which was compelled to spend that much more than was taken in in order to make the day's programme successful.

Littleton appealed for funds to 20,000 citizens, most of them men of means. Only \$7,104 was received, he says. It means roughly that each of the 20,000 New York patriots contributed 35 cents.
